# You'll get bargains in Singapore

MADE TO ORDER

Custom-made goods require a little more thought and, of course, more time.

Every shopping centre has at least one optical shop, ready to bargain over the price of stylish frames, and to fill your opthamologist's prescription in about 24 hours. Expect to pay about half of Canadian prices.

Clothing orders, too, may in a pinch be filled within 24 hours. although a tailor ought to be given at least three days if possible. Men will find tailor shops in almost every shopping centre and hotel arcade, but care needs to be exercised in selecting a competent craftsman - the good ones aren't inexpensive.

Dressmakers' outlets are more widely dispersed around Singapore, and their prices cover a broader range. Rabiah Flemming and Bobby Chng are among the top designers.

Many visitors to Singapore bring back fabrics, in silk or batik, to be made into dresses at home. Arab Street is lined with little shops that overflow onto the sidewalk with their Thai, Chinese and Japanese silks, and batik from Malaysia, all sold by the metre. One shop that seems to be popular with visitors is Mohamed Thamby, 99 Arab St.

SHOPPING TIPS Here are some guidelines for

Singapore shopping: -Comparison shopping is

strongly recommended if you plan to buy expensive items such as cameras or sound equipment. Don't hesitate to haggle.

-Be sure to obtain an internaguarantee on such equip-

ment, although merchants may be reluctant to issue one and may even increase the price if you insist upon it. Check to see that it is properly completed and endorsed with the store's stamp.

-Antiques should be more than 80 years old, and the merchant should issue a certificate of antiquity and a receipt for customs purposes. Examine each piece for cracks, chips and repairs.

-You can airmail your purchases home, up to a maximum of 10 kg. Post offices sell protective mailing cartons, in four standard sizes.

-Complaints about merchants should be directed to the Consumer Association of Singapore, Trade Union Annex, Shenton Way. telephone 221-6238. Remember that the city-state is noted for its strict laws and law-enforcement.

-Although Singapore is a major Asian financial centre, Canadian, dollars aren't readily accepted. even at banks. Take U.S. funds: travellers cheques get an appreciably higher rate of exchange than greenbacks.

-Duty-free shopping is, of course, available at Changi airport, not only on departure but also on arrival. Prices are fixed. If you run out of time there, air carriers such as ! Finnair (which flies between Singapore and Toronto via Helsinki) carry many of the same products, including electronics, for duty-free sale in flight.

Other airlines serving Singapore include Air Canada (from Toronto via London and Bombay), British Airways (from Toronto via London) and Cathay Pacific (from Vancouver via Hong Kong).




