The GDHS Rebels senior girls volleyball team chalked up their second consecutive East Halton "B" Pool match-win in a Monday afternoon at home, by easily handling Loyola High School of Oakville in straight sets, 15-8 and 15-8 in the best-of-three match.

Rebels are defending Halton champions and last year's runner-up in the OFSAA-qualifying Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference tournament, behind eventual second ranked provincially Brebeuf High School of Hamilton, so Clark has high hopes for this year's squad.
