Sunny Acres thrash Dundas

A combination of the flu bug and a strong third period surge by Milton served to end Georgetown's Sunny Acres Farms major midgets unbeaten streak and hand the hometown squad its second defeat of the season, 4-3, in a Tri-County contest played Thursday in Milton.

The Georgetown crew rebounded with a vengeance on Sunday, at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena and Dundas became the unwitting victim as Sunny Acres roared to a solid, 7-0 victory.

The win and the loss runs Sunny Acres Farms season record to 15-2-1, the class of their Tri-County division.

Only nine players suited up for the game in Milton, as illness swept through the team. Milton took advantage of the manpower shortage to claim the narrow 4-3 win.

The game was scoreless after one period and Sunny Acres enjoyed a slim 3-2 lead after two periods.

While the depleted Georgetown squad sagged in the third, Milton rallied for two late goals - over the final six-and-a-half minutes of the game - to post the win.

Eric Long, Rob Boyle and Mark McIntyre scored the Georgetown goals, with Brad Amato collecting two assists.

Single assists went to Sean Guistini, and Rich Bond.

Paul St. Pierre played between the pipes for Sunny Acres Farms.

As has been the team's habit this season, it took awhile for things to jell against Dundas, Sunday afternoon at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.

Through most of the first period, passes went astray, play was scrambly at times and no real serious threats were mounted in the Dundas end.

The game turned around quickly, however, in Georgetown's favor late in the first period and early in the second stanza.

Sunny Acres scored with just six seconds left in the opening period and potted four more markers in the second frame for a 5-0 lead heading into the final period of play en route to the satisfying 7-0 win.

While not severely tested, Peter Downs had a solid game in the Georgetown goal to earn the shutout.

Mark Lorito played a major part in erasing the memory of the loss to Milton, by scoring a hat trick.

Single Georgetown markers went to Rob Boyle, Brad Tutt, Mitch Butt and Rich Bond.

Butt also collected three assists, while Bond and Trevor Elinesky had a pair of helpers.

Single assists went to Tutt, Mark McIntyre, Boyle and Gorde Burke.

Monday night, Sunny Acres Farms journeyed to Milton once again for a game against the Milton "B" team. At press time the score was not available.

Sunday afternoon, 4 p.m. at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, Sunny Acres Farms play host to Chinguacousy.
