Raiders woes continue

Old habits are hard to break - especially bad ones.

Such was the case for the Georgetown Pontiac-Buick Raiders in a pair of Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League, West Division, games played over the weekend.

Raiders dropped a 5-2 decision to Burlington Cougars in a game played Friday night in Burlington then suffered a 10-5 setback at the hands of Milton Merchants Saturday night in a game played at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.

The losses dropped the Raiders season record to 3-16 and mired the team even deeper in the cellar of the league's West Division. Raiders now trail sixth place Brampton Capitals by seven points and are in danger of sinking out of sight.

Raiders were looking forward to re-entering league play following the team's unsuccessful, but educational, sojourn at the 12th Annual Pepsi Junior Classic hockey tournament.

Prior to the tournament, the Raiders had broken out of a month-long slump and posted wins over Brampton Capitals and Burlington Cougars.

Raider coach Peter Sturgeon was hoping that the twin wins, combined with the Pepsi tournament experience would stand his club in good stead heading back into league play.

Unfortunately, such was not the case as untimely lapses again proved costly to the Raiders.

The Raiders were very much in the contest against the Cougars Friday night but couldn't solve the magic of Burlington netminder David Smeriglio.

The game was tied 2-2 entering the second period but then Smeriglio took centre stage.

He blanked the Raiders through the final two periods while Burlington counted three times to ice the 5-2 win.

Chris Lee and Brent Presswood were the Raider marksmen against Burlington with Rob Doucette, Adam Hagen and Chris Lazarowff drawing assists.

Curtis Green had a steady game in the Georgetown nets.

Against arch-rival Milton Saturday night at home, the Raiders spotted the Merchants seven goals over the first two periods while managing but two replies and this proved to be the difference in the game.

The teams matched three-goal third period efforts toround out the final score to 10-5 in Milton's favor.

Curtis Green played the first period in the Raiders nets with Shawn Reis getting the call for the final two periods.

The goaltenders couldn't be held

totally to blame for Milton's offensive barrage as Green faced 20 shots while Reis faced 42 shots.

Chris Lazarowff paced the Raider marksmen with two goals and an assist. Marty Savoy, Chris Lee and Jim English rounded out the Raider scoring.

Former Raider Kelly Foster, had a goal and an assist against his former mates. Foster also was involved in a minor tussle with Adam Hagen in the third period.

Raiders must regroup once more and have two games on tap this week.

Thursday (tomorrow) Georgetown travel to Brampton while Saturday night, 7:30 p.m. at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, Raiders play host to Brampton Capitals.
