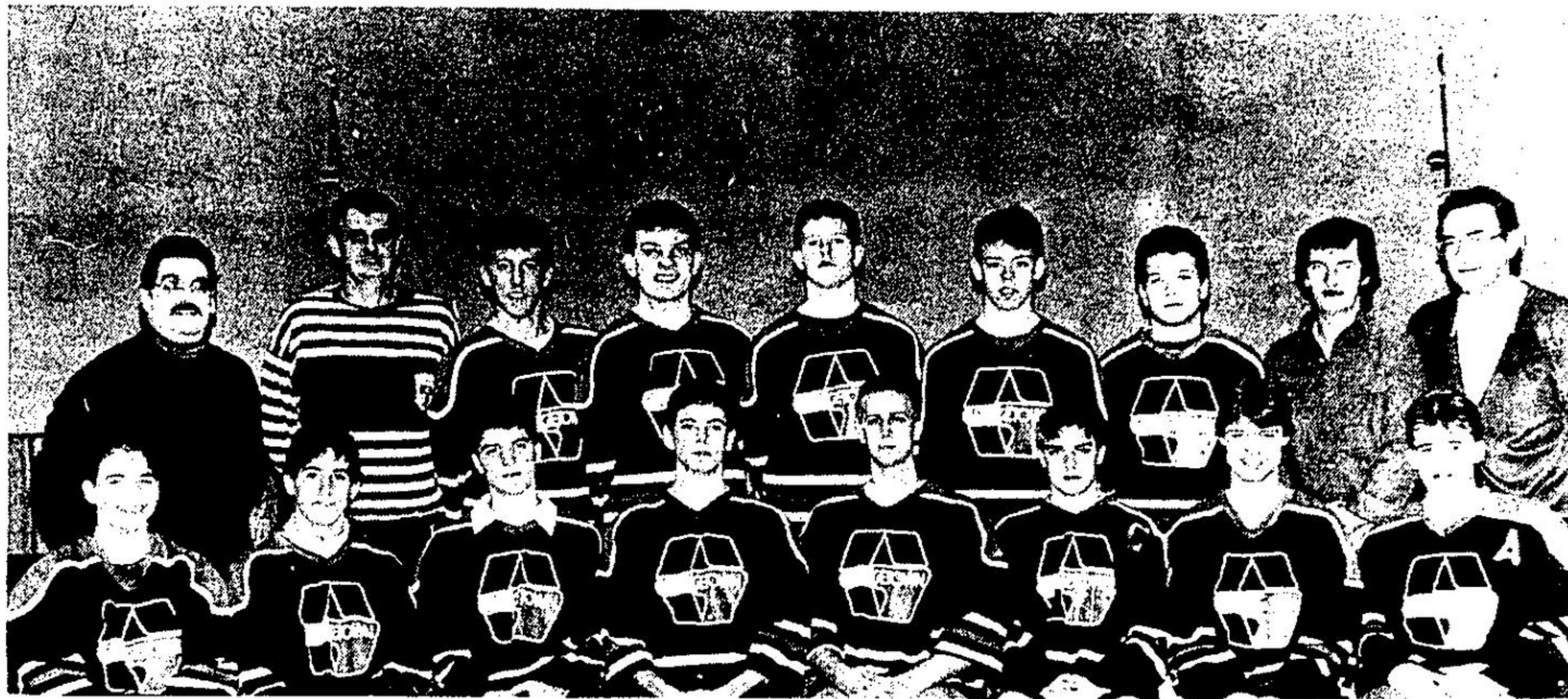

Gord Burke, Rich Bond, Jake Poulstrup and Mark Lorito shared

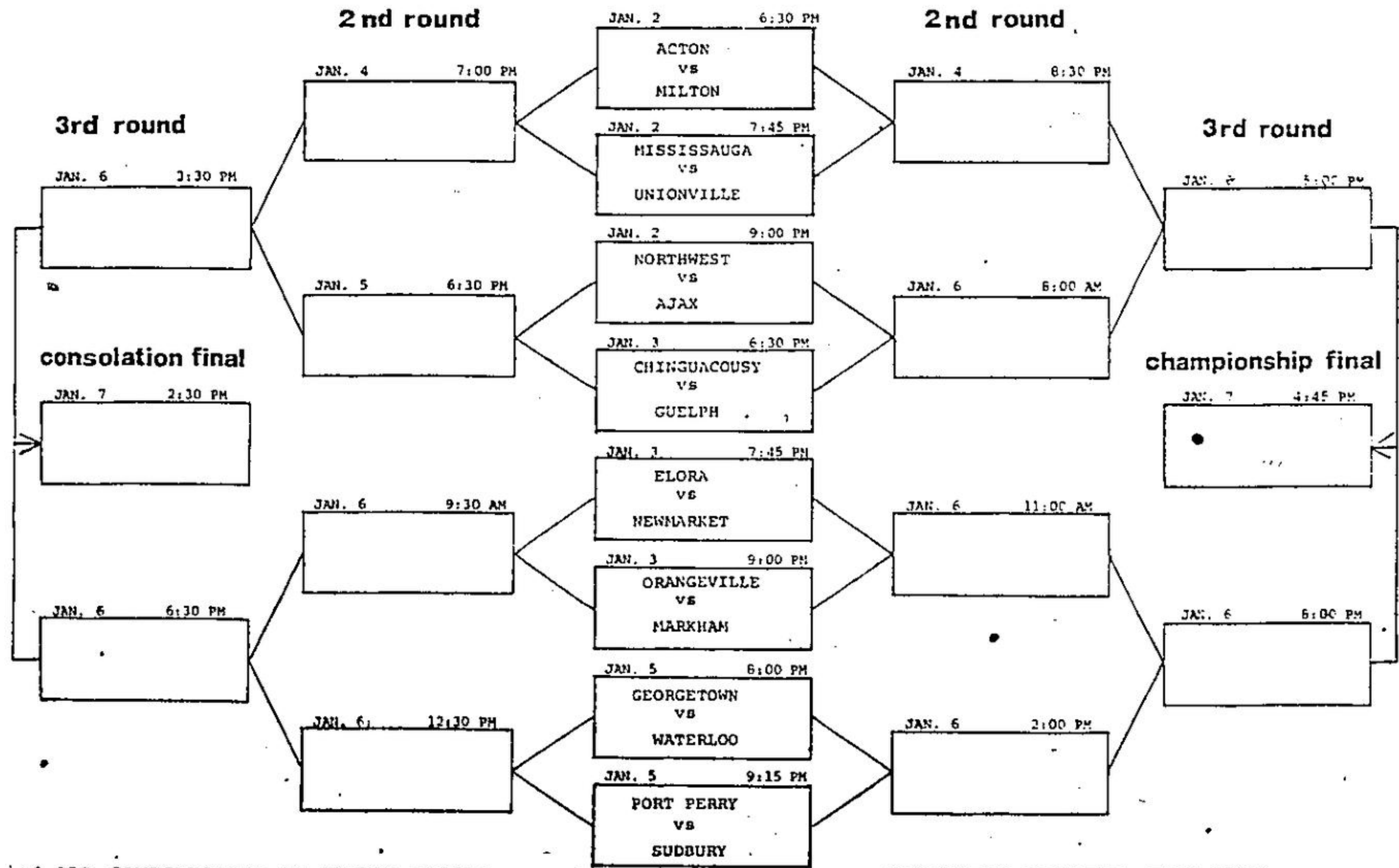
in the Georgetown scoring.
