Talent on display at All-star game

Many of Canada's multi-talented hockey players from the Ontario and Quebec Major Junior Hockey Leagues will be showcased in the fifth annual OHL/QMJHL All-Star Challenge to be staged at the Cornwall Civic Complex on Tuesday evening, Jan. 30, 1990 with the opening faceoff slated for 7:30 p.m. In a joint statement released recently, officials representing the participating leagues announced details for the game.

The two teams, comprised of players representing the cream of the crop of both the OHL and the QMJHL, will again meet for the Chrysler Challenge Cup in a single-game, winner-take-all contest.

Reserved seats for the contest are now at the Civic Complex box office. Ticket prices are \$8 each for adults and \$7 each for senior citizens and children and students 18 years old and under. Cornwall Royals season ticket holders will be able to purchase their same seats for the all-star contest at a special discount reduction of \$1 per ticket under these prices. Their seats will be held until Dec. 31, 1989.

Co-sponsored by Chrysler Canada and Molson Ontario Brewery, this hockey season marks the fifth consecutive year that the all-star squads from both leagues have met each other.

"Chrysler Canada Limited is again proud to be associated with this prestigious hockey event," said William Hill, manager, sales promotion services, marketing division for Chrysler Canada Limited. "I know that fans in this area are going to be treated to another spectacular display of exciting hockey during this contest."

Pat LaForge, vice-president, sales for Molson Breweries Ontario Division, echoed Hill's sentiments. "We at Molson salute those participants in the Ontario Hockey League/Quebec Major

Junior Hockey League All-Star Challenge - the players, coaches, managers, officials, organizers and most importantly, the fans of major junior hockey," said LaForge.

Last year's event, staged at the Forum in Montreal, Quebec was a one-game competition won by Quebec 5-2. The previous year's single-contest confrontation, staged at Copp's Coliseum in Hamilton, was also won by the "la belle province" contingent by a 4-2 final count.

During the two previous years that the match-ups were held, the annual competition involved a two-game, home-and-home series played in Ottawa, Ontario and Hull, Quebec.

In 1987, the QMJHL won the opening contest 7-4 in Ottawa. The next evening in Hull, the OHL rebounded from the previous night's loss to record a 5-4 victory in overtime. Under an agreement between the two leagues prior to the 1987 competition, it was decided that the winner of the second contest would take home the Chrysler Challenge Cup, regardless of which team won the opening game of the series.

In the inaugural event staged in 1986, Quebec won both games trouncing Ontario 11-4 right in Ottawa, and then just edging their rivals the next night in Hull by a 6-5 count.

In addition to the team trophy, the Chrysler-Molson Player-of-the-Game Awards will be presented to the most outstanding players from both the OHL and the QMJHL sides.

Players, coaches and officials comprising both teams will be honored at the OHL/QMJHL All-Star Challenge Luncheon to be held at 12 noon on Tuesday, Jan. 30, 1990 at the Cornwall Civic Complex.
