1989 is history

Sabres bow to Cougars



Acton Sabres closed out 1989 play in the Mid-Ontario Junior "C" Hockey League on a bit of a disappointing note, losing a hard-fought 5-3 decision to Schomberg Cougars in a game played last Thursday (Dec. 21) in Schomberg.

The shorthanded Acton squad (illness and injury cut the roster to 14 players, including two goaltenders) put up a spirited fight but in the end just came up short.

Cougars led 2-1 after the first period and 3-2 after 40 minutes of play.

What proved to be the winning goal was scored just before the midpoint of the final period and the clinching fifth-Cougar tally was scored into an empty net.

Jay Jasper, Paul Coverdale and Jamie Curren were the Acton marksmen.

Dean Bower donned the pads for the Sabres and despite the loss, showed well coming back from a leg injury.

Sabres bid farewell to 1989 sporting a 9-15 won-loss record, a vast improvement over the previous season's full term 6-29-1 mark.

Sabres resume Mid-Ontario Junior "C" Hockey League play Jan. 3 with a game in Alliston against the Hornets.

Sabres next home contest is slated for Jan. 5, 8 p.m. at Acton Community Centre against Caledon Flyers.
