Police Beat

Trailer stolen

Halton Regional Police say a small flatbed trailer holding a 1979 Yamaha snowmobile and another 1976 snowmobile was stolen in Acton sometime during the night of Dec. 29. Total property loss is estimated at \$2,400.

Stereo stolen

On Christmas Day a vehicle in a downtown parking lot was broken into. Police say the culprit attempted to steal the 1982 Oldsmobile but failed. The culprit stole the stereo and mechanical tools valued at \$800.

Windows hit

Police say three front windows of a business at 150 Armstrong Ave. were hit by pellets from some type of pellet gun. The windows were damaged on Dec. 28 at an estimated cost of \$1,000.

Cash stolen

Somebody broke into an Ashgrove tire company last week stealing cash and 12 passenger tires causing a total of \$1,950 in damage and property. Police say the thieves smashed a large plate glass window to get inside.

Jacket missing

Someone broke into a 1989 Hyundai Dec. 30, taking a ski jacket and personal papers, police say. The estimated cost of the theft, in a Norval parking lot, is \$400.

Charge laid

Police have laid charges against a 17-year-old youth for possession of stolen property. This follows an investigation into the theft of a ski jacket from a locker in the Georgetown District High School. A court date has been set for Feb. 22.

Car fire

Policemen and firefighters attended a car fire Dec. 31 on 10th Line north of Sideroad 17 which totally destroyed a 1984 Lincoln. The cause of the fire is undetermined and damages are estimated at \$20,000.

\$20 missing

Somebody entered an unlocked 1979 Monte Carlo on Delrex Boulevard during the night of Dec. 29. The person slightly damaged the interior and took \$20 worth of coins, say police.

\$30 damage

On the night of Dec. 29 someone entered an unlocked pick-up truck and stole a wallet containing about \$30, police say.

\$300 damage

Vandals at Churchill Road in Acton threw a real estate sign through the rear window of a 1987 Aerostar causing \$300 damage on the night of Dec. 29, say police.

Man charged

A Georgetown man has been charged with turning left across the path of another vehicle on Dec. 29. A man driving a 1986 Ford heading west on Guelph Street started to turn into a private drive when a 29-year-old Streetsville woman travelling east collided with the Ford, police say. Both cars received moderate damage.

Two-car collision

A 22-year-old Georgetown man has been charged with careless driving following a two-car collision Dec. 27. A 42-year-old man driving a 1989 Mercury westbound on Maple Avenue stopped to make a left into a private drive when a 1985 Nissan also travelling west collided with the Mercury. Debi-Lori Wilson, 16, a passenger in one of the cars, was taken by ambulance to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital. She was treated for minor injuries and released. Both cars were severely damaged.

Moderate damage

Following a two-car collision a 35-year-old Georgetown man has been charged with following too close. A 62-year-old Mississauga man was slowing down to make a right hand turn from Mountainview Road onto Barber Street in his 1974 Oldsmobile when a 1986 Mercury collided with him on Dec. 27. Both cars received moderate damage.

Cars collide

Police laid a charge of improper lane change against a 33-

year-old Georgetown man on Dec. 27. A man driving a 1987 GMC turned left onto Guelph Street and collided with a 1984 Oldsmobile as it was passing.

Charges laid

Charges of crossing into the other lane and driving in contravention of conditions were laid against a 22-year-old Acton man on Dec. 26. A 1986 Chevrolet went out of control while turning a bend on Elizabeth Road and swerved into a 1986 Chevrolet which received moderate damage.

One-car accident

Halton Regional Police say inexperience at the wheel contributed to the causes surrounding a single-car collision involving a 16-year-old Bishop Reding Secondary School student from Georgetown, Sunday.

Police say a 1980 Pontiac, driven by the 16-year-old male, went out of control and struck a pole on Ninth Line near Sideroad 10 Sunday afternoon.

An unidentified brown vehicle passed the Pontiac shortly before the accident, allegedly distracting the driver, who was travelling on a snow-packed highway.

Police say there were no injuries in the collision between the car and the pole.

No charges will be laid.

Trees struck

A car Halton Regional Police say was avoiding a collision with another car on Tweedle Street in Glen Williams, struck two trees before becoming "inoperable" Thursday afternoon.

The 1985 Ford, driven by a 63-year-old Glen Williams man, pulled to the right near Bennett Place when it skidded, struck a tree, and reversed and went sideways, before striking a second tree.

The 3:30 p.m. accident left the Ford with moderate damage. The driver was uninjured. No charges will be laid.

Sign struck

A 24-year-old Acton man is charged by Halton Regional Police with failing to report an accident causing property damage and with not having a valid driver's licence after a car he was driving Friday afternoon struck a traffic sign near Limehouse.

Police say a 1989 Ford was eastbound on Sideroad 22 shortly before 1 p.m. Dec. 22 when it went out of control on a slippery road and slid down into an embankment near Fourth Line.

The driver of the Ford was not injured. The car was moderately damaged.

Jewellery stolen from

Milton home

Halton Regional Police in Milton are requesting assistance in identifying the person or persons responsible for the entry and theft of \$2,800 in jewellery and silverware from a Milton residence.

On Tuesday, Dec. 12, 1989 a home situated on the north side of Childs Drive at Coxie Boulevard was entered by forcing the side entrance to the house. This was a daylight entry, taking place sometime between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Jewellery and silverware valued at \$2,800 was stolen. Included in the missing property are two sets of silverware, one for



a setting of six and the second for a setting of eight.

Among the jewellery taken was a gold charm bracelet with about 20 gold charms which included an anchor, a heart, a lady bug, several small keys and two gold lockets.

Police have charged Shoppers Drug Mart twice since they started cracking down on illegal Sunday openings in early November. When asked whether police had charged his store, Mr. Fraser said he heard charges were laid but he hasn't received a summons.

Detective Mike Kingston of 11 Division in Georgetown said the

police are in the process of issuing a summons.

Shoppers Drug Mart was charged under the act with having more than the maximum allowed number of employees working in the store on a holiday.

No more than four people are allowed to work on a holiday, the act says.

Besides the two most recent charges, the store has only been charged one other time, a couple of years ago, said Mr. Fraser.
