Mayor Russ Miller was among the hundreds of people who were ringing in the new year at the gathering at the Civic Centre Dec. 31. For the first time all of Halton Hills celebrated the new year in one place.

Previously two celebrations, one at Knox Presbyterian Church in Georgetown and one at the old Town Hall in Acton were held. The mayor held a levee the next day at the civic centre.

GTA meeting to be held in Milton on Jan. 11

A meeting to discuss Halton's role in the five-Region Greater Toronto Area initiative on landfill will be held Jan. 11 at E.C. Drury School for the Hearing Impaired in Milton.

The open house will be from 6:30 p.m. to 7:15 p.m., followed by a public meeting between 7:30 and 10 p.m.

The school is located on Highway 25 between Main Street and Derry Road. The meeting will be held in the auditorium entered through the doors under the clock tower.

Halton Regional Chairman Peter Pomeroy says Halton's involvement with Metro, Peel, York and Durham in the GTA is "a commitment to embark on a public process" to deal with waste management.

The Chairman says Halton residents should continue the trend of recycling and reducing the amount of waste going into landfill sites.

He asks Halton residents to "make a New Year's resolution to become involved in solving the waste management problem facing our Region."

Man charged with attempted murder misses trial

A 30-year-old Georgetown man facing a charge of attempted murder failed to show up at a scheduled court hearing on Dec. 29.

Kevin Blackmore was being examined at the Clarke Institute of Psychiatry in Toronto after being ordered to undergo psychiatric assessment by a provincial court judge in early November. He was scheduled to stand trial last Friday.

Toronto Metropolitan Police laid charges after a woman was stabbed several times in her Queen's Quay apartment in Toronto on Oct. 23.

Susan Bassett underwent emergency surgery for a punctured liver at the Toronto General Hospital. She has since been released.

Police say the woman was stab-

bed a half hour after watching videos with the Georgetown man.

The police apprehended a suspect leaving the apartment.

The police say it can take a couple of days to put out a warrant for the arrest of a person who misses their trial.
