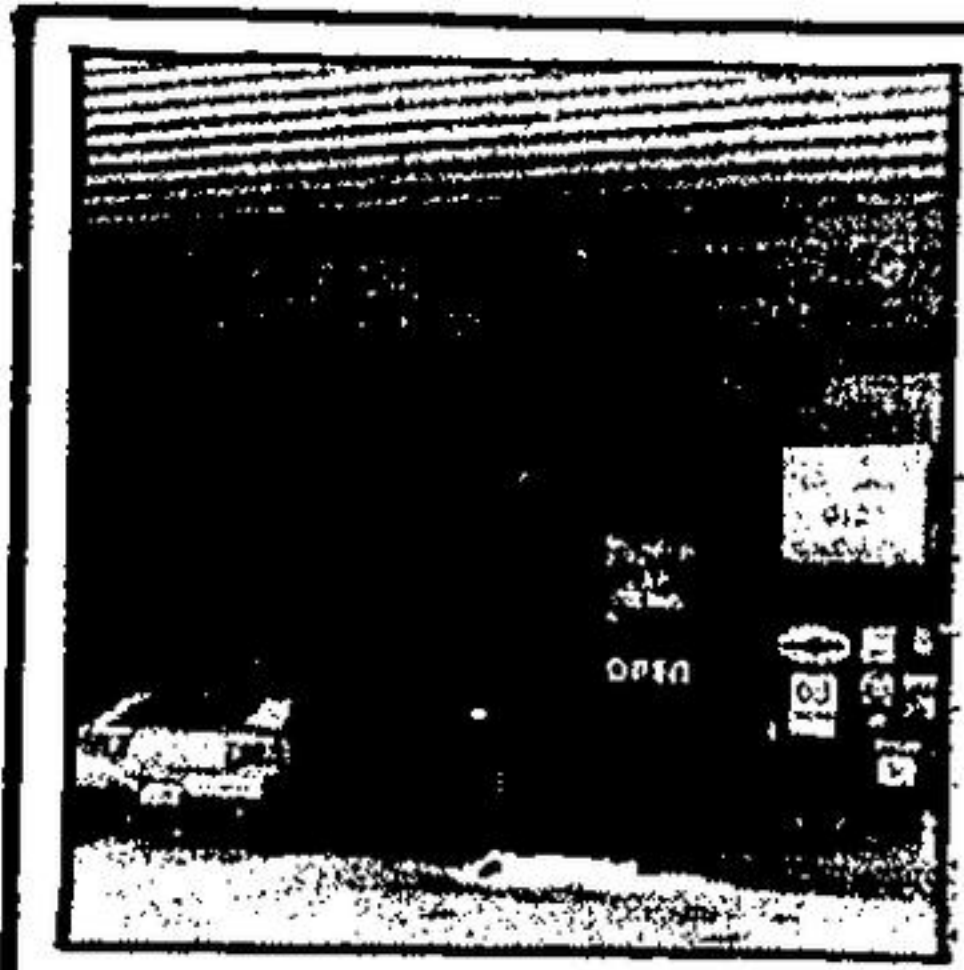
Residential canvassing will take place between Feb. 7 and Feb. 14.

Threatened with knife

Acton youth fights off two attackers

Police are looking for the public's help in identifying two youths who apparently attempted to rob a 15-year-old Acton youth, Jan. 10 at 3:30 p.m.

Halton Regional Police say the victim was told to hand over his jean jacket by two youths. One of the culprits pulled a black-handled knife with a five-inch blade, police say.

Police were told the victim kicked the knife out of the culprit's hand, cutting his shoe, and then kicked the person in the chest. The two youths fled the scene, police say.

One of the suspects is a 16 to 17-year-old, six-foot tall white male who has light-brown shoulder-length hair. He was wearing a black denim jacket and jeans. He also carried the knife, police say.

The other suspect is a five-foot, eight-inch tall white male who was wearing a blue toque and had a "chipmunk face." He was wearing a ripped jean jacket and torn jeans, police say.

1990 HYDRO RATES

Ontario Hydro has announced that the wholesale cost of power purchased by Halton Hills Hydro-Electric Commission during 1990 will increase by 6.27% effective January 1st, 1990.

Due to the higher cost of wholesale power and the higher cost of providing service, Halton Hills Hydro-Electric Commission finds it necessary to increase the 1990 retail rates an average of 7.02% effective January 1st, 1990, as follows:
