## Raiders roster revamped

Georgetown Pontiac-Buick Raiders dragged their bruised hockey machine to Streetsville Tuesday night and the Derbys demolition crew added more insult to injury by skating away with an 11-6 win over the Georgetowners. At press time, no further details were made available on the game.

Raider scoring leader, Brent Presswood, is joined by teammates Chris Lazarowff and John Williamson in the top sniper category - each has 13 goals.

Presswood still leads the team with 34 assists and 37 total points.
