If you are ever wondering what life was like in Northern France during the early 1900s look no further than Georgetown resident Maria Beeney.

This incredibly spry looking woman, who was born in Buray, France in 1900, celebrated her 90th birthday with her 11 children, the eldest being 71 and youngest being 44, 38 grandchildren and 43 great grandchildren at the Georgetown Lions Club Hall, Sunday afternoon.

Ms. Beeney, who still retains a slight French accent when speaking English, left France in 1919 after marrying Edgar Beeney, a Canadian soldier, posted overseas during the First World War. Mr. Beeney died in 1983. They had been married for 64 years.

The couple first settled in Woodstock where they were farmers, a profession they followed until selling their Limehouse farm in 1950.

The couple moved to Limehouse in 1935.

"I was never on a farm before I was married," she said.

But Ms. Beeney loved her new life so much that she says, "I would go back to the farm anytime."

Ms. Beeney attributes her health to taking life one day at a time and "letting the good Lord take care of the rest."

When asked if there is a secret to her age, she said, "I like to eat, sleep and garden." She also pointed to the many years as a member of the Catholic Women's League and sewing.

"Georgetown has changed for the better" over the years, Ms. Beeney says. "There are many new buildings and a lot more people." And "everyone is always so friendly."

Ms. Beeney says she's "the most blessed mother in the world. They (her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren) are all so nice."

Her extended family came from Mississauga, Brampton, Midland, Toronto, Owen Sound and Georgetown to celebrate the occasion. Ms. Beeney also has a granddaughter in Calgary who was unable to attend the birthday.

Ms. Beeney said after being an only child she would never have only one child. Instead she decided on


