

## Police Beat

### Jewellery stolen

Halton Regional Police say \$8,200 worth of jewellery was stolen from an Edith Street home in Georgetown between Jan. 20 and Jan. 22. The window of a rear door was smashed to gain entry into the residence, police say. The culprits selected only valuable jewellery and left costume jewellery behind. Twelve jewellery items worth between \$300 and \$1,500 were taken before the culprits left through the back door, police say.

### Stolen jewellery

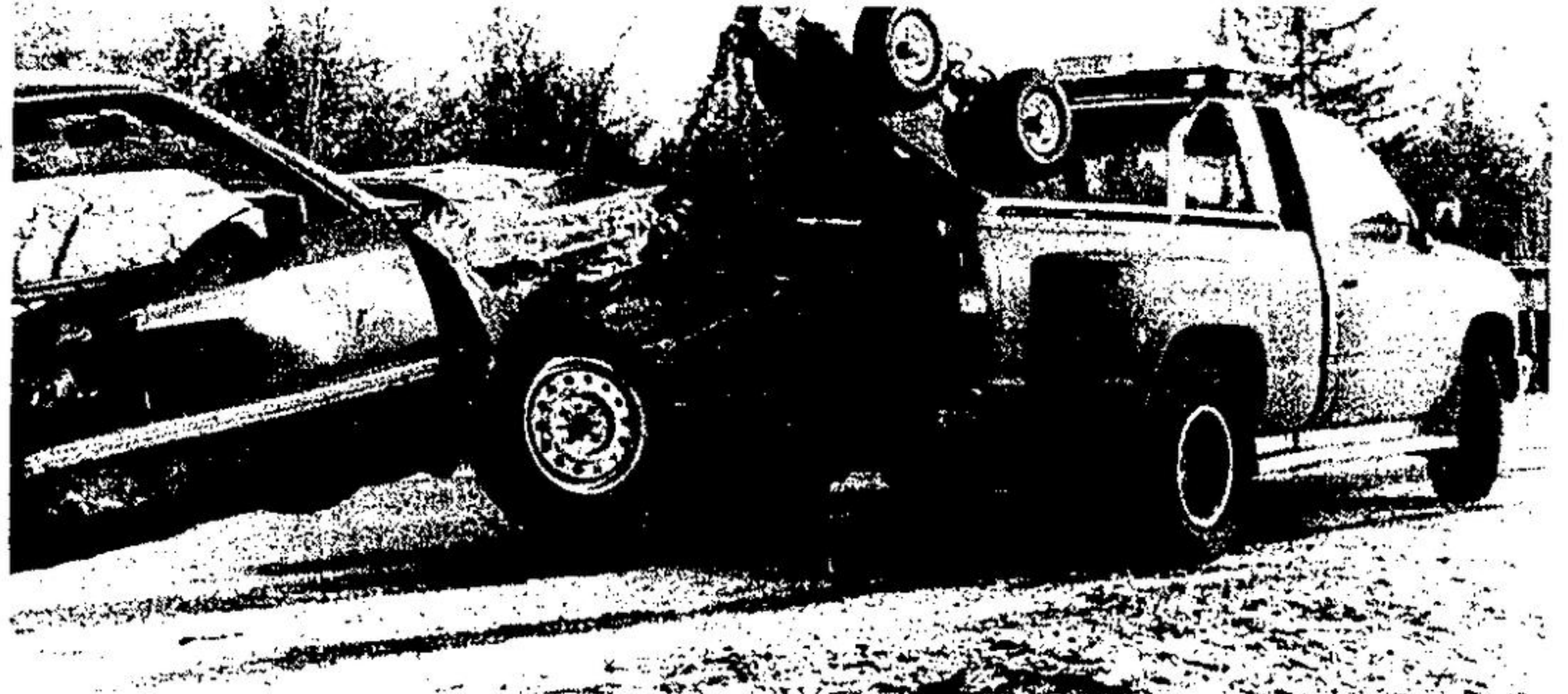
Between Jan. 19 at 1 p.m. and Jan. 20 at 6 p.m., somebody broke into a Parkview Boulevard home in Georgetown and stole \$1,000 worth of jewellery, police say. The house was not ransacked and other valuables were not taken, so the theft may have been the work of a professional, police say. The thief got into the home by using a prybar or a large screwdriver to pry open the rear door.

### House entered

A man woke up to the noises of a person breaking into his home on Jan. 23, police say. The man found the culprit entering his Rosset Valley Crescent home through a side window that the man had pried open, police say. The suspect fled through several backyards.

### Charges laid

Police have charged two Orangeville residents with assault following an incident in which a knife was held at a 22-year-old Halton Hills man's throat. A 20-year-old woman has been charged with assault and a 22-year-old man has been charged with assault with a weapon, police say. On Jan. 22 at 11:30 p.m. the Orangeville duo were having dinner when an argument started. A woman allegedly pulled the hair of a 20-year-old Halton Hills woman, pulling her off of a sofa, police say. A man allegedly pulled the hair of the Halton Hills man and forced his head back putting a knife to his throat, police say.

## Dump proposal's future will be clearer after February report

If the proposal is rejected by an EA board public hearing and the board forced RSI to pay court costs, the proponent would disappear to avoid payment, audience members speculated.

RSI is a consortium of four companies. POWER members argued the companies would dissolve the consortium to avoid any penalty.

The ministry is aware of this kind of scenario, but it has taken measures to ensure this won't happen, said Mr. Sharp.

Audience members wanted to know if there is a link between the RSI proposal and the Greater Toronto Area group. The GTA is examining interim and long-term solutions to solve Metro area garbage problems.

Mr. Sharp said to the best of his knowledge the Acton site was not submitted to the GTA's Solid Waste Interim Steering Committee as a possible garbage disposal solution.

SWISC is currently looking at

about 80 waste disposal proposals submitted from around the world.

But POWER members think the RSI could sell its license for the site to another company which in turn could include the site as part of its submission to SWISC.

Mr. Sharp said it is good for POWER to be aware of the GTA but it should concentrate its efforts primarily on the RSI proposal.

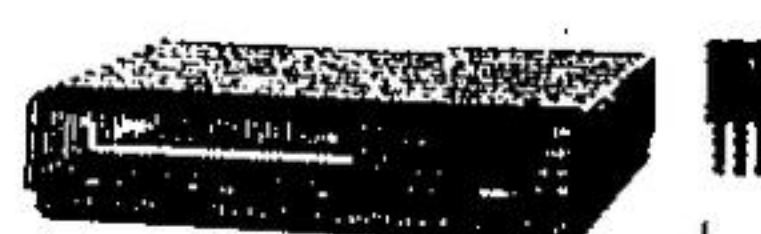
