
How the PGA follows leaders

STAT SHEET



1990 marks the start of the second decade of the official PGA Tour statistics. This program compiles figures in nine golfing categories: scoring leaders, driving distance, driving accuracy, greens in regulation, putting leaders, par breakers, eagle lead-ers, birdie leaders and sand saves.

Designed to help touring pros identify the parts of their game that need the most work, the totals are compiled by "walking scorers," who pass them on to the Tour statistician. The data is then sent to the main computer in the Tour headquarters in Florida, which issues weekly updates of the standings.

Who had the best stats for the past 10 years?

The scoring leader, among players with a minimum of 350 rounds on the PGA Tour in the 1980s, was Tom Kite, with an average of 70.57 per 18 holes. He was followed closely by Tom Watson (70.67).

Not coincidentally, they also rank 1-2 on the PGA Tour's all-time money list. Going into 1990, Kite had won \$5.6 million in his career; Watson had taken home nearly \$5.2 million. By the way, Watson won 16 tournaments in the past decade (a figure matched by Curtis Strange). Kite was first 11 times.

The honors in driving distance in the 1980s went to Davis Love III, the youngest of the decade leaders. Love, who will not turn 26 until this April, averaged 279.7 yards per drive. The runner-up: Greg Norman (276.5).

On the other hand, a veteran won the driving accuracy title in the 1980s. Calvin Peete, who did not take up the game of golf until age 23, has dominated in this category. 1989 marked his ninth consecutive year as the leader. His overall mark of .813 is 44 points ahead of Mike Reld in second place.

To get a better idea of Peete's dominance, consider that a difference of just 48 points separates the next 10 players on the list!

Peete also took first place in greens in regulation, making him the only pro to lead in two categories in the 1980s: He narrowly edged Bruce Lietzke, .709 to .705, with John Mahaffey third at .704.

San Diego-born Morris Hatalsky set the pace among putters. On greens hit in regulation during the past decade, he averaged 28.51 putts per round. Willie Wood, the former two-time All-American from Oklahoma State, trailed Hatalsky with an average of 28.77.


Aussie Greg Norman was the decade leader in par breakers with a percentage of .216. Tom Watson once again finished second, at .207. By the way, Norman was one of only three players to finish in the top 10 during the 1980s in four of the nine categories. Kite and David Frost were the others.

Since par breakers represent the average of total birdies and eagles out of total holes played, you might expect to find Norman's name among the leaders in one, or both, of those other categories.

Surprisingly, he does not even make the top 10.

In eagle leaders, Fred Couples led the way, with a total of 81, or one more than Craig Stadler. Bobby Wadkins took first place among Birdie Leaders, with 3,502 during the past decade. Curtis Strange finished second with 3,341.

The final category — sand saves — is the only one in which there was a tie for first place. Two foreign-born play-ers — Isao Aoki of Japan and David Frost of South Africa - finished in a dead heat with identical marks of .43.






