Anyone for the Sault? Speak up, and fast! Or, we may "forever" be classed as cowards!

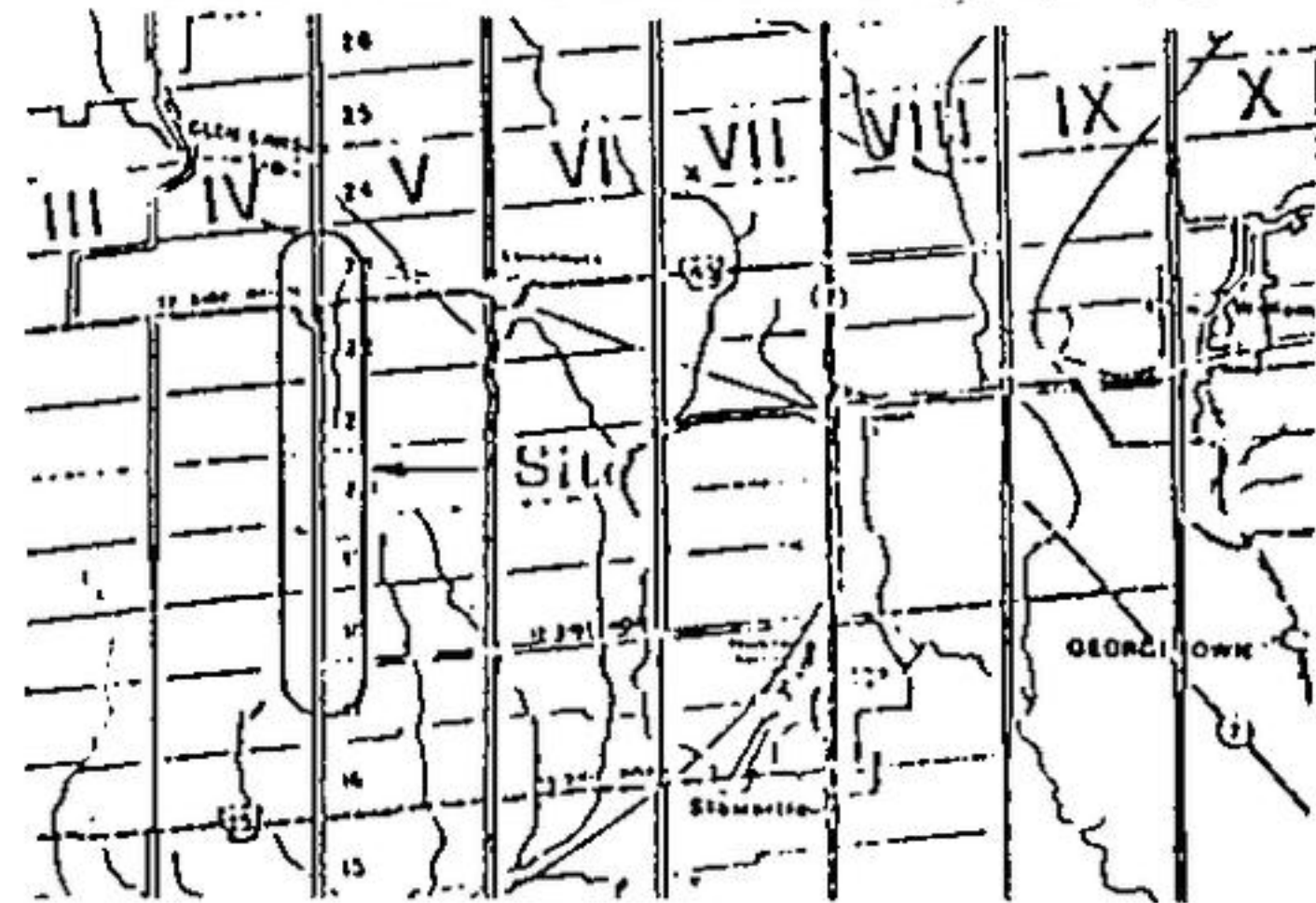
