Halton Cable Systems moves to new building

Halton Cable Systems in Acton is no longer the small kid on the block of cable television. "We've outgrown our present facility," says the cable station's vice-president and general manager John De Jong. Construction on the station's new building is set to begin as soon as "the weather clears and the frost leaves the ground." The new building will be located just up from the existing building, which is situated at 11 Main Street North in Acton. Town councillors unanimously approved construction of the

building at last Monday's council meeting. Halton Cable Systems made the application to build a new building last July. The station needs a new building, Mr. De Jong says, because of the rapid growth in cable programming. The new building will allow the station to more than double its programming services, he said. "We'll be bigger and better." As for the existing building, it will be sold. The company is currently entertaining an offer but wouldn't reveal who has made the offer.

Two-vehicle collision

A 35-year-old Burlington man has been charged with an improper turn after the 1988 Ford he was driving collided with a 1987 GMC Jimmy driven by a 50-year-old Georgetown man at 11:45 a.m. on Feb. 6. Both vehicles were travelling eastbound on Armstrong Avenue when the Ford attempted to make a right hand turn into a private driveway. The truck was in the left turn lane waiting for the lights to change on Trafalgar Road at Sideroad 17, and the Honda was in the straight through lane. Both vehicles attempted to turn left police say. The truck received light damage while the car received moderate damage.

Rifle seized after shots are fired

An Acton man was taken into custody by Halton Regional Police after an incident in which a friend heard gunshots while talking to the man over a phone at 2:20 p.m. Feb. 13. The incident happened at a Highway 7 residence east of the Fifth Line.

The Acton man's friend contacted a family member who in turn contacted police for the man's safety.

Numerous police officers attended the scene. The man came out a side door of the house, police say.

He pointed the gun toward a wooded area at the rear of the house. Sergeant Dave Pruitt ordered the man to put his weapon down. Police say the man obliged, then was told of his rights and taken into custody.

Police seized an unloaded 22-calibre rifle at the scene. The man has been released unconditionally, police say.

According to the police the family is having a friend remove all weapons from the man's house.
