

New building should be ready for fall fair

An additional agricultural building on the Georgetown Fairgrounds property will allow the Georgetown Agricultural Society to host more agricultural exhibitions than previous years, says the society's secretary-treasurer Bob Malcolmson.

The society already owns a building on the property and the proposed galvanized steel-sided barn would be attached to this building, said Mr. Malcolmson.

To increase the number of exhibitions during the Fall Fair, he said the society needs an additional building that can be locked to secure the displays overnight. A tent, therefore, would be inappropriate, he explained.

The town approved the construction of the building subject to a site plan review at Monday's council meeting. The town also approved that the building fee of \$415 for the proposed building be waived.

The society is currently preparing a submission for the town site plan committee that will be ready in two or three weeks, Mr. Malcolmson said.

He is optimistic the committee will give the go-ahead for construction to begin this spring so that the building will be ready for this year's fall fair.

Horticultural society meets in Acton

The Society hopes that citizens of the community will co-operate in this effort to improve the appearance of the town.

The site plan process usually takes about two months once a submission has been made, says town planner Glen Wellings.

Under normal circumstances a site planning process isn't required for an agricultural building. But because the site of the building is in a community park next to residential homes, staff recommended that the public have a chance to comment on the proposal.

"Area residents, property owners (developers) and major park users (Highland Games and Bang-O-Rama) would not have had a chance to comment on the current proposal which could have led to criticism of town administration in dealing with the issue," the staff report warned.

The town's director of Recreation and Parks, Tom Shepard, who wrote the staff report speculates the proposal will present no "real problems" and it should pass through the site plan process relatively quickly.
