

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NBA is capable of scoring 30-or-more points on any given night.

Although you have to be able to score to play in the NBA, there are some pros who keep their roster spots mainly because of other talents. Rebounding, for example.

The majority of the top NBA rebounders, such as Akeem Olajuwon, Charles Barkley and Karl Malone, can "fill it up" pretty well. But there are several top "glass" men with a less-than-nodding acquaintance with the net.

In fact, among those NBA players with at least 100 rebounds last season, 15 had more rebounds than points scored.

The leader of this rather specialized crew was Charles Jones of Washington. The 6-foot-9 Jones pulled down 257 boards while scoring only 136 points in 1,154 minutes played.

That works out to 1.89 rebounds for every point scored - the highest such ratio in the league.

Following on Jones' heels were two other players not usually associated with scoring. Mark Eaton of Utah was runner-up, pulling down 1.66 re-

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bounds per point (843 to 508), with Greg Kite of Charlotte and the Los Angeles Clippers third at 1.62 (243 to

By the way, Jones and Kite were also the only members of another little-publicized group last season: NBA players with more personal fouls than points (minimum 100 personals). Jones fouled 187 times, for a ratio of 1.38 fouls per point, with Kite second at 1.07 (161 fouls).

In the category of playmaking, there were four NBA players who totaled more assists than points (minimum 100 assists). Utah's Jim Les led the way with 1.56 assists per point scored (215 to 138). Following him were Tyrone "Muggsy" Bogues of Charlotte (1.47, 620 to 423), Nate Mc-Millan of Seattle (1.31, 696 to 532) and Craig Neal of Miami and Portland (1.04, 118 to 114).

Locals Darby Erler, Stephanie O'Brien and Christie Hallet now have a weekm off from tournament play before travelling to Windsor, Feb. 24.



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
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
