Senior Rebels ski team to challenge at provincials formidable cross-country running

The Georgetown District High School Rebels senior boys Nordic Ski Team is off to Sudbury this weekend with high hopes and an impressive roster of individuals, to compete in the provincial interscholastic Nordic skiing championships which will be staged just off the campus of Laurentian University.

It is expected that upwards of 25 teams from across Ontario will challenge in this year's OFSAA championships and Rebel team coach John Moore gives his team an outside chance of finishing amongst the top 10 teams.

"We have the talent," said Moore, "but it all has to come together at the right time."

The GDHS senior boys team competing at OFSAA includes Eran Andrechek, Scott Symmes, Kevin Schneider, Dwight Spence and Tim Parker.

Bob Donker, a noted GDHS distance runner, who competed for the team at the Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference championships, held recently, will not be accompanying the team to Sudbury.

The Rebels won the GHAC meet, ahead of Nelson High School of Burlington.

Earlier in the high school Nordic skiing season, the Rebels took part in two meets, both staged at Hardwood Hills, just north of Barrie.

Both meets attracted approximately 500 entrants from 25 high schools in Ontario and the Rebels acquitted themselves well.

In the first meet, the Rebels team didn't place because they couldn't field the minimum number of four competitors.



However, with a full team complement the second time around, the Rebels placed seventh overall -

quite an achievement. The Sudbury OFSAA course for sneior boys is 8.2 km in length and the race will be staged this Mon-

Eran Andrechek is a first-year team member, hailing from Sault Ste. Marie and he placed 10th at the GHAC meet.



Herald Sports Editor The Georgetown District High School Rebels swim team is peaking at just the right time, according to team coach Shirleen Robert Weston in the open boys 100 Vella and Georgetown's chances in the upcoming interscholastic provincial championships - scheduled for the weekend of March 2 and 3 at Etobicoke's Olympium swimming complex - look promising in a number of events.

The Rebels competed in the Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference championships last Wednesday and the results were impressive.

The open girls medley relay event was won by the Rebel team of Mandy Stinson, Cynthia Eccles, Kristin Herner and Louise Willms.

Cynthia Eccles won the open girls 50 metre freestyle event and Cam Oomen won the senior boys 100 metre backstroke event.

Coach Vella was also pleased as 15 swimmers posted personal bests in a number of events.

Glen Oomen had personal bests in the backstroke leg of the open boys 200 metre medley relay and the open boys 100 metre backstroke.

Julie Robertson posted personal bests in the open girls 100 metre backstroke event and the open girls 200 metre freestyle event.

Sara Mulholland topped her previous efforts in the senior girls 50 metre and the senior girls 100 metre freestyle events.

Steve Atherley swam to personal bests in the senior boys 50 metre freestyle event and the senior boys 100 metre backstroke event.

Other personal bests were recorded by Andrew Morris, in the senior boys 50 metre freestyle event; Kristin Herner in the open girls 100 metre butterfly event; metre butterfly event; Janine Glaser in the senior girls 100 metre freestyle event; Dawn Newman in the senior girls 100 metre breaststroke event; Dave Inglis in the third leg of the senior boys 200 metre freestyle relay event and Mathew Zuraw in the open boys 100 breaststroke event.
