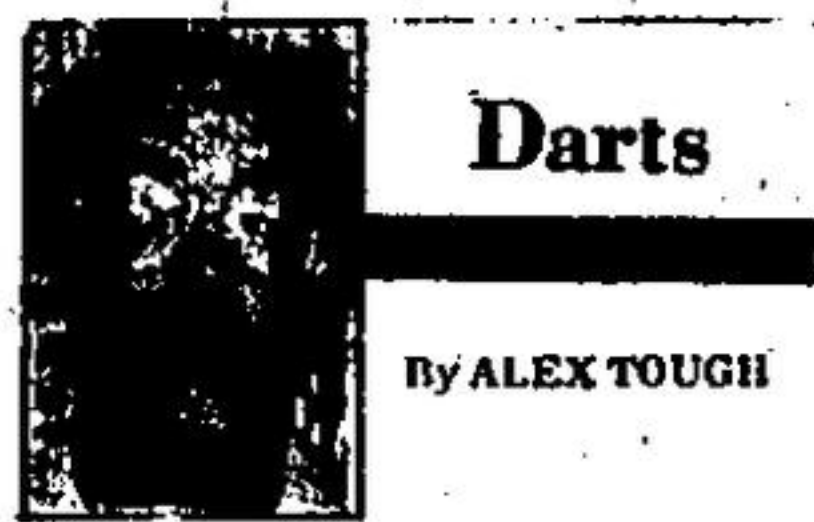
Three high scores from Rick Harden, two from Erwin See and one from Terry Hancock and all for the visitors.
