Dave Kentner steps down as Raider president

It's official. As reported in last Wednesday's Herald, Dave Kentner has ended speculation and is stepping down as Georgetown Pontiac-Bulck Raiders president and won't contest the position in the Raiders executive elections scheduled for March 6, 7:30 p.m. at the Cultural Centre on Church Street.

In a letter delivered Tuesday to Raider secretary, Vicki Pasma - and released for publication - Kentner cited increasing business demands as the main reason for him relinquishing the office of team president.

Kentner is out-of-town on vacation and couldn't be reached for further comments on his decision.

In his letter, Kentner had nothing but praise for his fellow behind-the-scene Raider coworkers.

"I am grateful for the efforts of all our executives, volunteers, coaches and players," Kentner wrote.

"We have accomplished so much

hockey as Georgetown's only OHA representative, broadening the local player participation, securing a major sponsor, recruiting the enthusiastic personnel who will guide this club in future years and not least of all - the development of talent to compete at higher levels."

In his letter, Kentner indicated he would still be willing to work with the Raider organization in some other capacity and also threw his support behind Finn Poulstrup, who similarly announced that he will be seeking the Raider presidency.

"I intend to support Finn Poulstrup in his effort to be elected president," Kentner wrote, "and I encourage you and all our executive to support him."

Poulstrup, a longtime member of the various Raiders organizations stated that the main reason he was running was because of Kentner's decision to step down.

"I want to ensure that the continuity and the stability brought to the Raider organization by Dave

Kentner carries on," Poulstrup said in a telephone interview.

Poulstrup has some ideas of his own concerning which direction the Raiders organization should take but felt it imprudent to discuss his ideas until after the Raiders executive elections which he is hoping will see him accept the president's chair.

Poulstrup has been associated with the Junior Raiders for the last four years but his roots as member of Raider organizations goes back much further, to 1977.

He served as a director for two years and as a vice-president for four years with the Raider Intermediates organization.

He served for three years as president of the Raiders seniors organization.

Poulstrup, a longtime member Raiders executive elections and the various Raiders organiza- can vote.

Aside from the president, three vice presidents, a secretary, a treasurer and a 10 person board of directors will be elected.

The Raider executive will serve a two-year term in office.




