O'Tooles Number Two dead-on against Time Out team

Ed Kouyoumjian, Erwin See and captain Terry Hancock particularly played very well. O'Tooles took the first five singles, ending up with six wins. Time Out came back with wins in the four doubles to tie the match going into the two teams sets.

It was too much effort after the poor start and the home team won both teams for the 8-6 historic victory. Over the past couple of years the players who have consistently given Time Out the most trouble have been Hancock's hurlers and it is fitting that they are the boys to burst the bubble of the league leaders.

See, Kouyoumjian and Hancock each scored a high score and Rick Harden popped in a maximum for the winners. Jim Carter closed 116, scored 140 to lead Time Outers. Pete Pickering (2), Ron Scarlett, Beau Beaumont and Brian Hicks also counted in the high score section.

Meanwhile, second place McGibbon I played their No. II ladies team and pulled off the win by 13-1 and crept a little closer to the top. Who was the "lucky" lad to lose a point? Not mentioned for a while is Gary Rodda. He has not played as much this year and was soundly walloped by Monica Southon. A defeat is usually guaranteed a comment in the column. Isn't it? Singles were tied 4-4 and three doubles to Kettle sealed the points.
