


Leprechaun Lloyd

Clever clover counter


Count the number of items in each clover. Draw a line to match the clovers with the same number of items. The first one was done for you.

Alfie wants to share his favorite Irish bread recipe with you. Follow the directions carefully. Get your mom or dad to help you.




3 cups flour

34 teaspoon salt

4½ teaspoons baking powder

½ cup shortening 1 cup buttermilk

Mix all dry ingredients and shortening together until crumbly. Add milk and continue to mix. Roll the dough onto a floured surface and cut into triangles. Bake the scones on a cookie sheet at 425° for 15 minutes. Serve with butter and jam.
