Bantam tournament Local teams post mixed results

The 1990 edition of the Georgetown International Bantam Hockey Tournament (30th annual) is well under way at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena and Halton Hills representatives have been posting mixed results.

Acton Firefighters and Georgetown Domtar are competing in "D" Division of the four division tournament, while Georgetown M and M Pro Sports are carrying local colors in "C" Division.

In all, 32 teams in four divisions are parading their shinny skills for area hockey aficionados with division championship games and the Grand Championship Final slated for Saturday at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.
