Bantam tournament M&M Pro Sports offer challenge

Georgetown's M and M Pro Sports bantam hockey team has emerged as the most likely candidate to carry Halton Hills colors onto the championship stage, as the 1990 edition of the Georgetown International Bantam Hockey Tournament (30th annual) wraps up today (Saturday) at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.

Championships in four divisions, plus the Grand Championship trophy will be up for grabs today (Saturday) capping a week that has seen 32 teams advance through division round-robin play in the hope of snagging a championship berth.

Each team was guaranteed three division games before entering sudden-death semifinal play yesterday (Friday) leading up to the championship battles for all the marbles.

Because of press deadlines, tournament results could only be obtained through last Wednesday.

At press deadline, M and M Pro Sports boasted a 2-1 record and rested atop the standings in "C" Division.

Acton Firefighters, through last Wednesday, sported a one-loss, one-tie record, in "D" Division, while Georgetown Domtar "B's", also competing in "D" Division had a 1-1, won-loss record.

Both Acton Firefighters and Georgetown Domtar "B's" were mired in the middle of the pack in "D" Division, so it's possible the two Halton Hills squads could square off in the "D" Division Final.

Georgetown's M and M Pro Sports got off to a disappointing tournament start last Saturday, losing their initial contest, 3-2 to Royal York.

Tom Diardichuck, in the M and M Pro Sports net, played a very solid game, heralding better things to come once the snipers got their sights in line.

M and M Pro Sports has since seen action twice and with all facets of the team's game coming together, posted a 6-1 win over Oakville and a 2-0 whitewashing of Preston.

The insurance goal wasn't counted until the last minute of the game with Preston pulling out all stops in an effort to gain the tie.


