

Narcotics charge

Halton Regional Police say two men were stopped near Eighth Line and Maple Avenue in Georgetown. One of the two men, a 21-year-old from Georgetown, was charged with possession for the purpose of trafficking and possession of narcotics. The other man, a 20-year-old from Georgetown, was not charged. Police seized three grams, about \$250 worth, of a substance suspected to be cocaine from the vehicle. The driver of the 1989 Ford will face the charges at the Milton courthouse May 7.

Nail-gun injury

A 25-year-old Durham man working at a business on Main Street in Acton was putting crates together with a hand-held nail gun, when he inadvertently put a nail into his knee March 23 at 10:45 p.m. The man was taken to Guelph General Hospital by ambulance, police say.

Condoms stolen

Two suspects entered a store on Main Street in Georgetown and stole a package of condoms at 10:10 p.m. March 24. Police say the theft was not actually witnessed but the cashier noted the two looking at the product and when they were challenged they fled the store.

Two-car collision

Three people were injured when two cars collided at Elgin Street and Agnes Street in Acton at 3:50 p.m. March 21. A 1981 Honda, driven by a 23-year-old Georgetown man, was travelling south on Elgin Street while a 1981 Ford, driven by a 19-year-old Acton man, was travelling east on Agnes Street. Police say the Ford went through the stop sign and collided with the Honda. A charge of failure to stop has been laid.

All three people injured received minimal injuries.

Eggs thrown

Three separate incidents of egg throwing may be related, police say. Between midnight and 7:30 a.m. March 24 two residences and a store were pelted with eggs. Between \$2,000 and \$3,000 damage was caused when eggs were thrown at a Mountainview Road South home and the cars in its driveway. At 3:20 a.m. a loud bang woke up another resident who found eggs had hit his home. A convenience store at the corner of Mountainview Road and Delrex Boulevard was also hit by the egg tossers. Police believe three youths were responsible for the damages. The investigation is continuing.

Windows smashed

Five windows were smashed at the Acton High School between 11:30 p.m. March 23 and 12:45 p.m. March 245. Police say the windows were broken by wine cooler bottles causing \$950 damage.

\$2,000 damage

About \$2,000 damage was caused when vandals kicked, scratched and pulled the mirrors of a Toyota parked on Sideroad 22 just east of Highway 7 between 1:30 a.m. and 4 a.m. March 3. The


