Milton Mac's CRIME STOPPERS Milk robbed

Halton Regional Police investigators in Milton are seeking two suspects who held up a Mac's Milk Store in Milton and escaped with the cash from the tills.

On Saturday, Feb. 10, at 4 a.m., two males wearing black stocking masks entered the Mac's Milk store situated at 472 Steeles Ave. in Milton. One was armed with a large butcher knife and the second a long, thin kitchen type knife. They accosted the lone clerk on duty and demanded the money from the till. Twelve lottery tickets and the cash were placed in a Mac's Milk plastic bag and the culprits left the store and walked east on Steeles Avenue.

The store clerk was not injured. The suspects are described as follows:

1) male/white, 180 lbs., 18-20 years, 6'0, medium build, wearing

tan gloves, red sweater, blue jeans and face covered with a black stocking mask.

2) male/white, 18-20 years, 5'9", 170 lbs., medium build, wearing white short sleeve shirt, light blue jeans, white running shoes and face covered with a black stocking mask.
