# Knights and Petes dominate coaches poll

Members of the London Knights and Peterborough Petes dominated the 1989-90 OHL Coaches Poll in their respective divisions by capturing six and five of 18 categories respectively. Individually, star centres Paul DiPietro of the Sudbury Wolves and Mike Ricci of the Petes led all players with DiPietro winning three categories, finishing second in two others and third in a sixth category while Ricci won two categories and finished tied for first in two others.

DiPietro was named the Emms Division's most dangerous player in the goal area, best stickhandler and also the best shot while finishing second as best skater and fastest skater and third in best on face-offs. Ricci was the Leyden Division's best playmaker and most dangerous in the goal area and finished tied for first with Cornwall's Owen Nolan for the best shot and with Belleville's Scott Thornton for best on face-offs.

Other winners from the Petes were left winger Dave Lorentz who repeated from last year's poll as the best penalty killer and was also named the best defensive forward this year and defenceman Jamie Pegg who took the most underrated player honors, edging out Belleville Bulls defenceman Derek Morin by one point, 17-16. Finishing a close third with 14 points was Kingston Frontenacs right winger Bob McKillop, Peterborough's Ricci also tied for the lead in two other categories, giving them firsts in a total of seven categories.

Among the London players who took the top honors in the Emms poll were right winger Steve Martell who was named the most under-rated player and the hardest worker and centre Chris Taylor who was the most improved player and was also third as the most dangerous in the goal area. Rick Corriveau was named best offensive defenceman and finished second in three other categories smartest player, best shot and hardest shot while teammate Trevor Dam was named the best


