Royal Pizza crowned

Royal Pizza continued with their domination of the Georgetown Non-Contact Hockey League right down to the final buzzer, slipping past Derbys 3-1 to claim the gold medal in the league's playoff "Day of Champions" last Sunday at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.

The gold medal win for Royal Pizza gave the team a hat trick in 1989-90 season play as the squad finished in first place at the end of regular season play and topped the league's playoff standings.

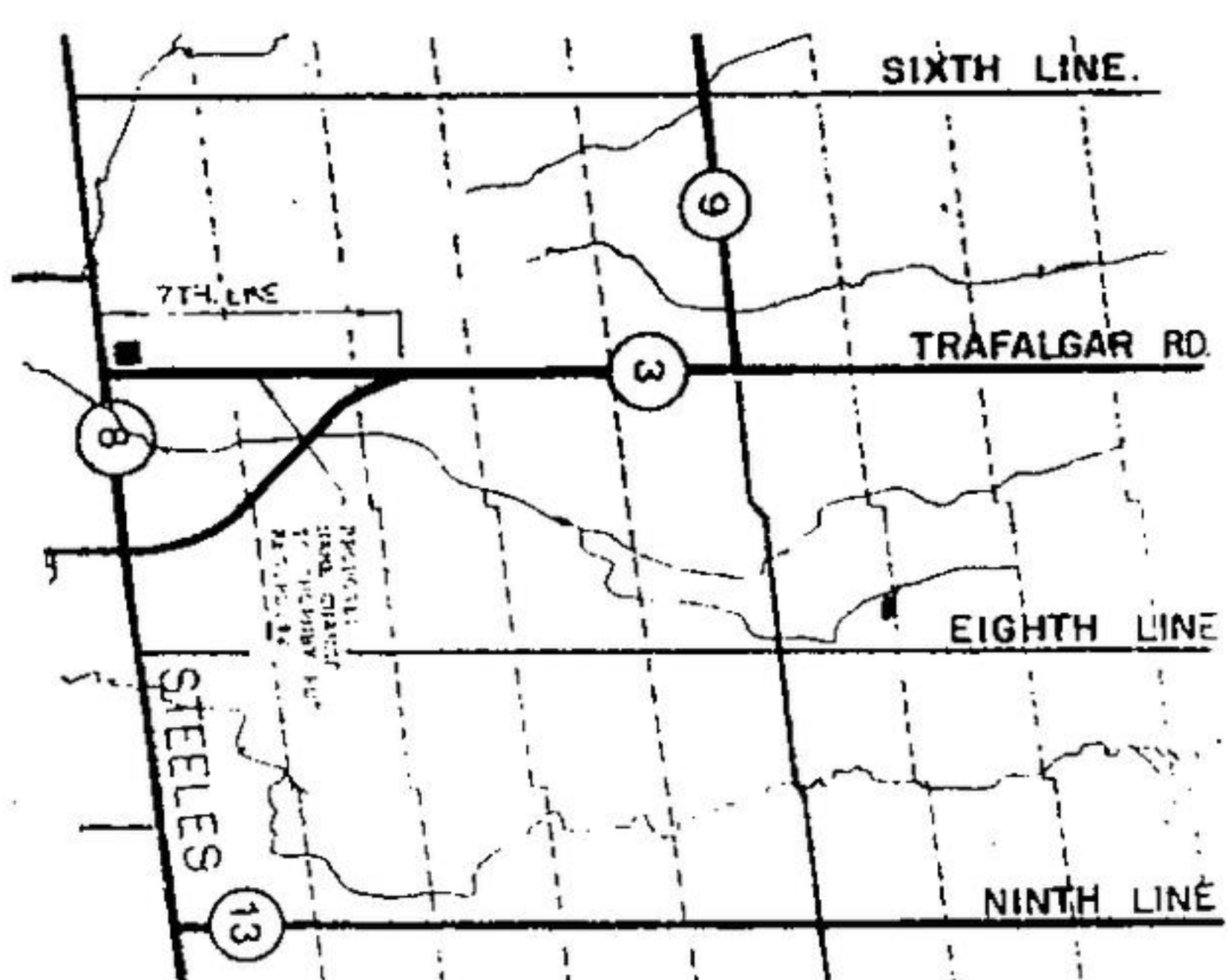
