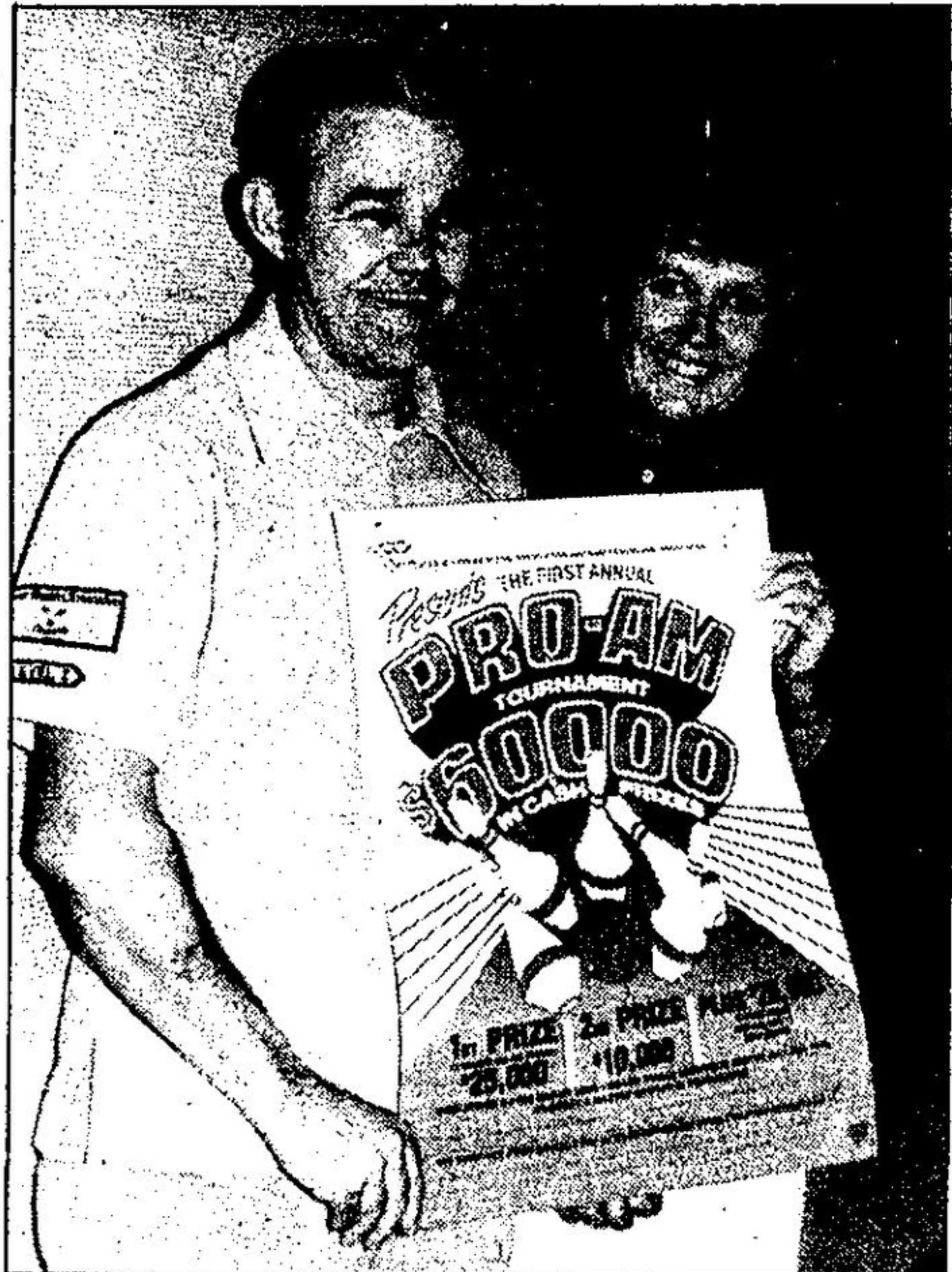


Georgetown Bowling Report

The opening round in the first Annual Pro-Am Tournament was held at Georgetown Bowl to qualify an amateur bowler to partner "Master-Bowler" Gord Lane.

A total of more than 40 five-pinner took part in this event their efforts being keyed to the top prize of \$25,000 in the coming finals to be held in Hamilton on May 18 and 19.

With Andy Parent supervising the competition as the official "judge of play," Eva England came through in the last game to win the coveted opportunity.

Every bowler taking part in this roll-off paid a subscription price of \$30 or was sponsored by others. Now, all the unsuccessful participants have hopes of being one of the ones picked daily for a prize of \$50 for 96 days, also a weekly prize of \$100, a monthly prize of \$1,000, each month or the final prize. On May 12 the final draw will be held for \$5,000.

In the bowling competition after the first game it appeared that some were going to outstrip the pack.

Marg Brosseau opened with a 305 for a plus 106 and Brinley Hole with his 302 but a higher average was only credited with a plus 76. Gerry Bos was in third place with a plus 70 while John Bailey came up with a plus 64.

The score of 339 for Russ Kowalchuk in the second game pulled him into the lead with a plus 129 and Debbie Hole was second with a plus 111. Marilyn Stephens moved into third with a plus 85 followed by Gerry Bos with plus 83.

The third and final game settled the winners list. Eva England with an average of 169 took top place honors with a plus 139 and Gerry Bos (194 avge) captured the runner-up spot with plus 120. Lu Zander (197 avge) moved up into third position with plus 115 and Russ Kowalchuk (187 avge) next with plus 104, for minor cash prizes.

Now, Gord Lane has the task of coaching his partner for the final event. In Hamilton, this tourney will be highlighted by gala cocktail parties and the victory banquet.
