# NEC wants say in hydro plan

**TORONTO** - The Niagara Escarpment Commission of Georgetown is among the groups planning to take part when the environmental assessment into Ontario Hydro's 25-year plan gets started next fall.

The commission identified itself as an intervenor during a preliminary meeting last week.

Other interest groups who asked to be among the intervenors included Georgetown's Waterpower Association of Ontario.

The groups will learn next month whether they are eligible for funding. Each intervenor group can apply for funding before May 15, with decisions to be made May 25.

There were 212 individuals or groups that identified themselves as intervenors.

Ontario Hydro's plan, a demand and supply study, was released in December and could affect various parts of the province in different ways. The plan, which has an

estimated cost of more than \$60 billion, considers such ideas as improved conservation of hydro energy and the creation of 10 new nuclear generators.

Also being considered is the purchase of power from private suppliers from throughout the province.

The environmental assessment to review the plan is tentatively set to start on Sept. 17. It will run for about one year.

A wide number of groups are interested in the environmental assessment and one applicant is representing 83 Indian and Metis groups. Hydro is considering translating the supply and demand study into Cree and Ojibway.

Q. Last year, I earned approximately \$60,000 and my wife's only income was from the family allowance payments. It is my understanding that because I earned over \$50,000, I will have to repay all or a portion of the family allowances I report on my tax return. However, because my wife had no income, could she report the family allowance on her return in order to avoid repaying any of the allowance?

A. No. Because you are the higher-income spouse, you must report the family allowance payments on your return. Therefore, you are subject to the repayment rules. You are still entitled, however, to claim the credit for dependent children.
