

### Four-car collision

Halton Regional Police say a four-car collision on Guelph Street just west of Maple Avenue in Georgetown at 12:45 p.m. April 7 sent two people to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital. Both were treated for minor injuries and later released. A 42-year-old Terra Cotta man, driving a 1986 Mercury, was at the front of a four-car line of traffic. When the Mercury slowed down the 1989 Jeep, driven by a 29-year-old Georgetown woman, and the 1989 Ford, driven by a 37-year-old Georgetown woman, also slowed. A 1985 Toyota, driven by a 22-year-old Georgetown woman, was unable to stop in time and collided with the Ford. The Ford then collided with the Jeep, which collided with the Mercury. The Toyota received moderate damage, the Ford received severe damage, the Jeep received moderate damage and the Mercury received light damage.


