

Halton Hills marathoners challenge in Boston

Halton Hills was well-represented in the Boston Marathon Monday, the annual trek over hill and dale in "Beantown" that this year attracted over 9,000 competitors.

John Grace of Acton and John Butler of Georgetown competed in the 00-39 men's category, while Judy Makhyoun, of Georgetown competed in the 00-39 female category.

Grace topped the Halton Hills contingent finishing 1,326th overall, with a time of 3:05:19.86.

Butler was next across the finish line finishing 1,388th overall with a time of 3:06:08.28.

Makhyoun finished 3,003rd overall in a time of 3:22:32.10.

Four hundred Canadians competed in this year's Boston Marathon, with Peter Maher of Toronto leading the way finishing 13th overall with a time of 2:15:25.

Only three other Canadians finished in the top 100.

Italy's Gelindo Bordin won the race in a time of 2:09:27.

In the process, he became the first Olympic champion and the first Italian to win the marathon. Bordin won the gold medal in the marathon at the 1968 Seoul Olympics.

Portugal's Rosa Mota became the first woman to win the female division of the marathon three times, crossing the finish line in a time of 2:25:24.

Terra Cotta ponds stocked with trout

MEADOWVALE - The 1990 Trout Season officially opens on Saturday, April 28th throughout the province.

"This year the Credit Valley Conservation Authority will again have the ponds at Terra Cotta stocked for trout fishing, says Community Relations Spokesperson Robert Peace.

"Other conservation areas offering good angling include Belfountain with wild brook and brown trout in the steam and brook trout in pond and Limehouse Conservation Area on Black Creek," says Peace. "Some trout that made it through Streetsville can also be found through the Meadowvale Conservation Area property."

This year the Forks of the Credit Provincial Park has introduced new angling regulations allowing only artificial lures. Anglers are only permitted one brown and one brook trout per day and the fish must be over 50 centimeters in length.

"There are no size restrictions on the trout elsewhere," says Peace, but anglers are reminded the Ministry of Natural Resources Atlantic salmon program is still very active and it is illegal to keep juvenile Atlantic salmon caught by accident."

"Anglers should always respect private property and must have permission of the owner in advance to fish on that property," says Peace.

The trout season is open from April 28 to Sept. 30 with some restrictions in effect beginning August 15 until the following season. Restricted areas along the Credit River after August 15 are the QEW to Hwy. 5 and Burnhamthorpe to the Reid Mill in Streetsville.

OHL Awards

Longo and Fraser honored

The Ontario Hockey League announced the winners of the OHL Rookie-of-the-Year (Emms Family Award) and OHL Overage Player-of-the-Year (Leo Lalonde Memorial Trophy).

Peterborough Petes right winger Chris Longo is the Emms Family Award winner as the OHL's rookie-

of-the-year to become the first Peterborough Pete to ever win the award. He received 40 points in the voting followed by North Bay Centennials defenceman Derian Hatcher with 24 and Oshawa Generals centre Eric Lindros with 22.

Longo, a 17-year-old Belleville,

Ont. native, picked up 74 points on 33 goals and 41 assists in 66 games to finish second in rookie scoring this season behind Sudbury Wolves centre Jason Young.

Last year's winner was Cornwall Royals right winger Owen Nolan.

Oshawa Generals centre Iain Fraser captured the Leo Lalonde Memorial Trophy as the OHL's Overage Player-of-the-Year while en route to leading the Generals to first-place overall.

The Generals team captain picked up 51 points in the voting for a four point margin over Belleville Bulls' goaltender Jeff Fife's. They were followed by Owen Sound Platers' centre Jamey Hicks who received 20 points. Last year's winner was Niagara Falls Thunder right winger Stan Drulia.

Fraser, a 20-year-old Oshawa native and captain of the Generals, is in his third full season with Oshawa and finished in a seventh-place tie in the OHL scoring race. He had 105 points on 40 goals and 65 assists in 56 games and started the season with a 15-game point scoring streak, picking up 18 goals and 15 assists for 33 points. He then had a 10-game streak from Dec. 5 through Jan. 4 and then finished the season with an eight-game point scoring streak.
