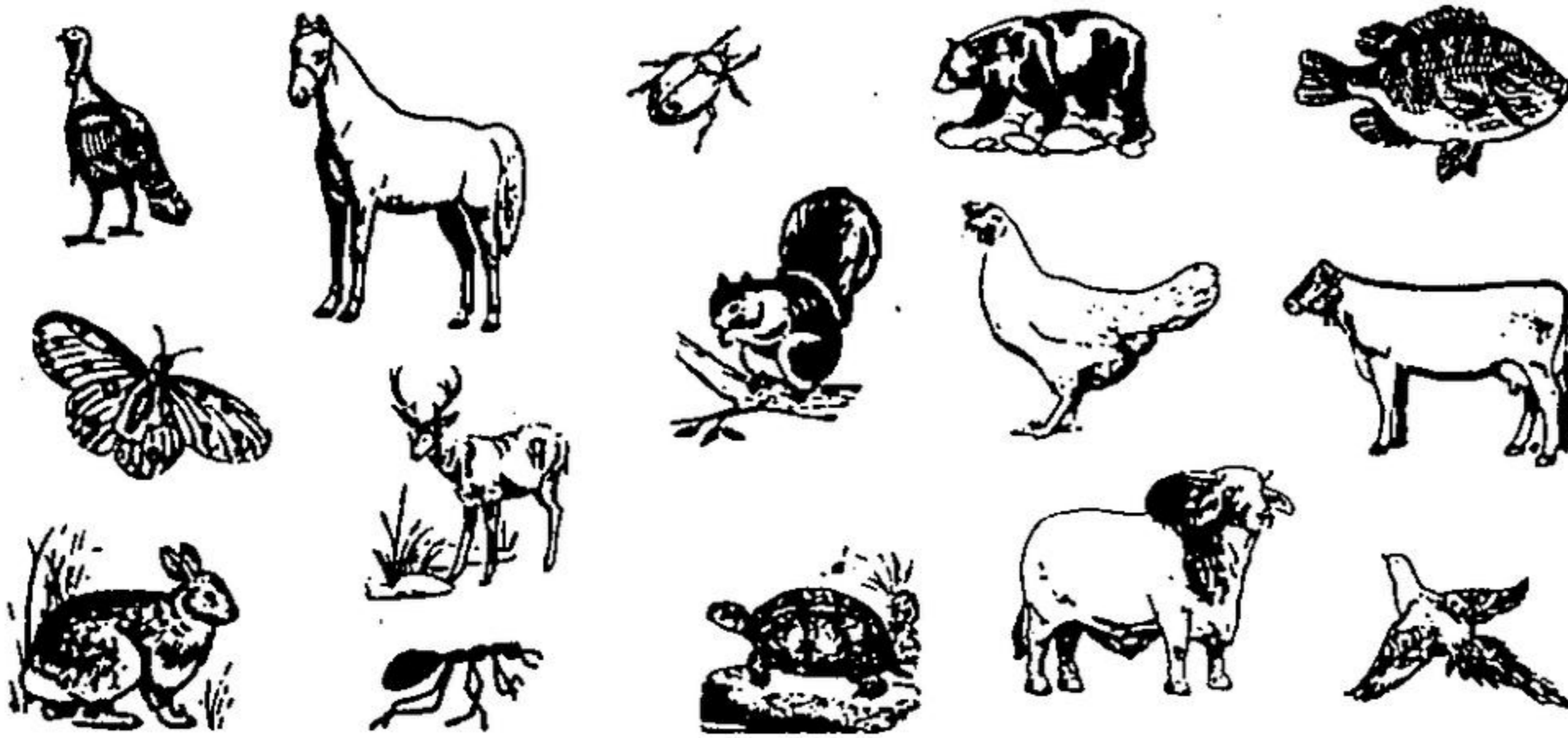

# Animals

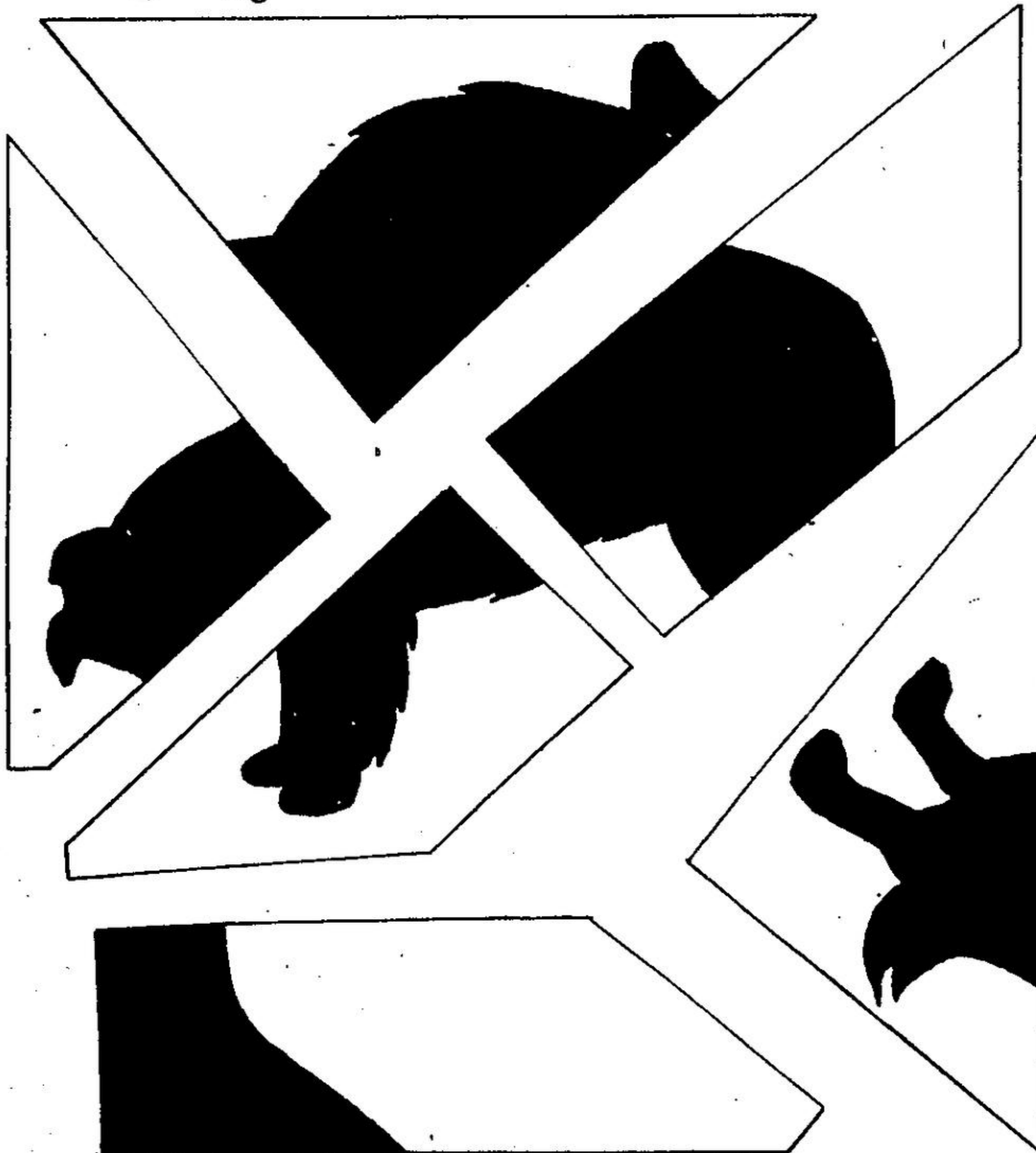

Answers: rabbit, horse, deer, squirrel, bear, bull, cow.

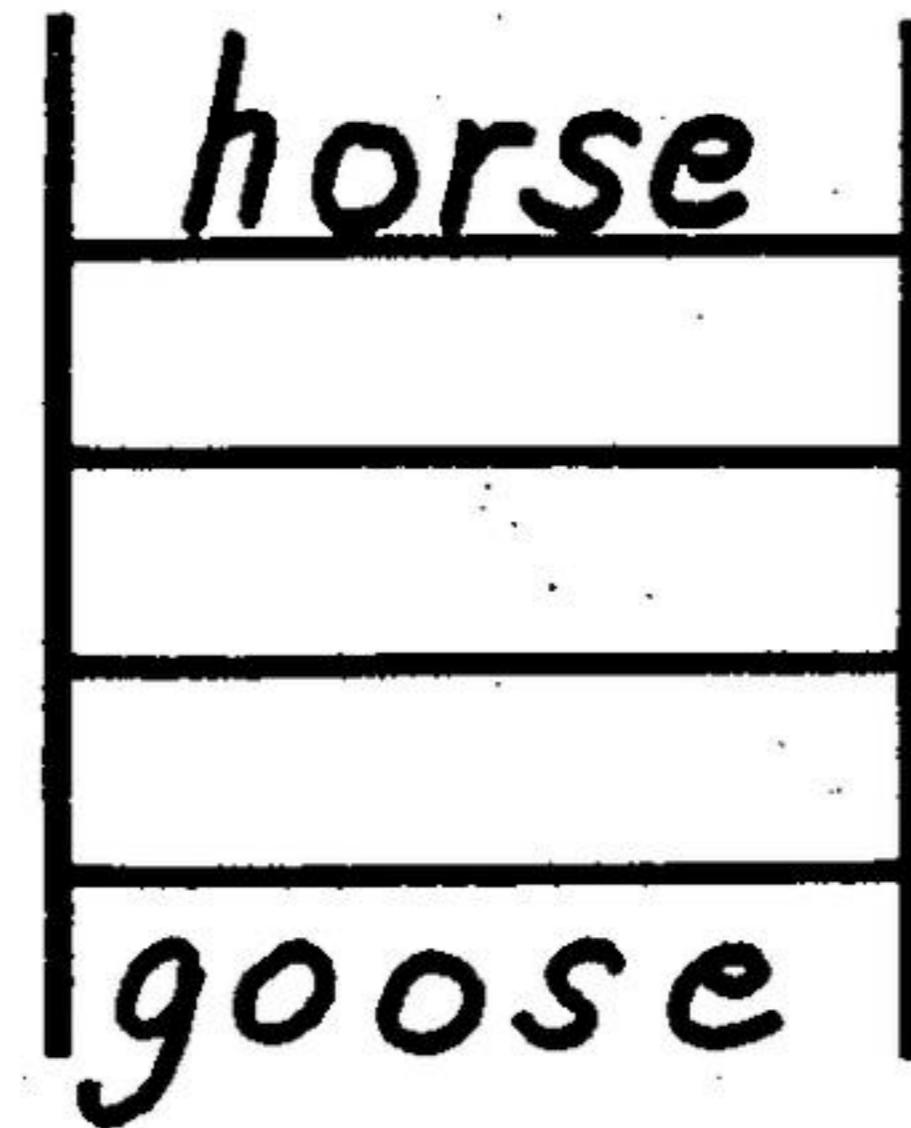


Collies are very popular pets. Correctly piece together the puzzle and you'll have the silhouette of this collie.
