

Police Beat

B and E charges

Halton Regional police say a 20-year-old Brampton man, an 18-year-old Georgetown man and two Georgetown youths have been charged with break and enter and theft. The arrests were made and most of the property stolen from the Saint George's Anglican Church has been recovered following an investigation by Constables Blase Wasser and Kevin McCart. Police arrested the four suspects April 20 and 21. A computer keyboard, printer, monitor and hard-disk drive went missing from St. George's Anglican Church overnight April 15. Also taken from the church was an answering machine.

Man injured

A 48-year-old Georgetown man was assaulted when he left a Norval tavern, police say. The victim had just left the establishment with his wife when he was thrown to the ground and kicked five times in the face, at 1:20 a.m. April 22. The man went to the Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital for treatment and was advised to return to have his nose x-rayed.

Stones stolen

About 800 paving stones were stolen in Hornby near the intersection of Trafalgar Road and Steeles Avenue between Nov. 15 and April 20. The complainant said the octagonal cobble interlocking paving stones were going missing slowly but since April 1 nearly all the stones have been stolen. The approximate value of the missing stones is \$900.

Youths charged

Two youths have been charged with break and enter, police say. A concession stand near the Sixth Line and Steeles Avenue was broken into when the culprits pried open a wooden door causing \$200 damage at 3:50 p.m. April 20. The two youths were arrested inside the stand.

Building entered

Someone broke into a building on James Street, in Georgetown, by prying open a sliding window between 8 a.m. April 10 and 4 p.m. April 18. The building was empty and is no longer used by the Town of Halton Hills.

Knife pulled after theft

Someone pulled a knife on a security officer outside the Olde Hide House at 5 p.m. April 21, Halton Regional Police say.

A man and a woman left the store with an undetermined amount of merchandise. The store's security alarm sounded when the two left. The head of security asked the two to return with her to the store.

The man grabbed the security officer by the arm in an attempt to push her away and then brought out a six-inch long double-edged knife, police say.

The two fled in a car. An off-duty Peel Regional Police officer witnessed the incident and attempted to stop the fleeing car, police say.

The car fled east on Highway 7. Police are still investigating the case.

Car damaged

The front fenders and hood of a 1989 Plymouth were dented between 1 p.m. April 17 and 10 a.m. April 18 causing \$800 damage, police say. The car was parked at an address on Moultry Crescent in Georgetown.

Tree struck

A 1989 Ford, driven by a 20-year-old Georgetown man, struck a tree after swerving to avoid three deers that were standing in the middle of Tolon Line, east of Sideroad 15 at 10:25 p.m. April 20.

Car-deer collision

Police say a 1986 Mercury received moderate damage when it collided with a small deer on Fifth Line south of Sideroad 5 at 12:40 a.m. April 23. The Mercury, driven by a 38-year-old Georgetown woman, was travelling north on Fifth Line when a deer started to run across the road and struck the car. The deer died.

Two-car collision

One person received minimal injuries in a two car collision at the intersection of Guelph Street and Mountainview Road at 11:05 p.m. April 20. A 1982 Buick, driven by a 17-year-old Georgetown woman, was turning left onto Mountainview Road when it collided with a 1982 Mercury, driven by a 18-year-old Erin man. Police have laid a charge of turning across the path of a moving vehicle in connection with the incident. The Mercury received moderate damage and the Buick received severe damage.

Vehicles collide

A 1987 Oldsmobile, driven by a 77-year-old Georgetown man, collided with a 1987 GMC, driven by a 49-year-old Acton woman. The cars collided at the intersection of Mill Street and Market Street at 2:20 p.m. April 20. Police have laid a charge of failing to stop. The GMC and Oldsmobile received moderate damage.



Intersection collision

Police laid a charge of an improper turn in connection with this accident which happened at 4:55 p.m. April 19 at the intersection of Guelph Street and Maple Avenue. A 1977 Chevrolet, driven by a 76-year-

old Georgetown woman, travelling westbound on Guelph Street, collided with a 1984 Pontiac, driven by an 18-year-old King City man, when the Chevrolet attempted to make a left turn onto Maple Avenue.

Halton Police and Crime Stop-

pers are seeking information on a break-in which occurred on Wednesday, April 11.

Some time after midnight a two-storey business complex located at the corner of Queen Street and Meadvale Road in Acton was entered by removing a ventilation cover on the roof and breaking through the ceiling into the second floor offices. These offices were searched and some cash was stolen.

The culprits then attempted to gain entry to a first floor variety store by smashing a two foot hole in the floor of a second floor office, but were unsuccessful.

The culprits then exited the

building via the roof.

Halton Regional Police report that during the first three months of 1990 there have been a total of 70 break and enters of all types in the Town of Halton Hills. Police have successfully cleared 31.14% of these cases. From a total of 445 reported criminal offences in the community, 251 remain unsolved.

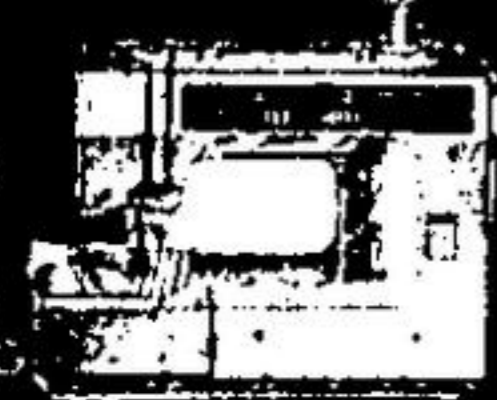
