Andrew Terrell - 2nd 100m backstroke, 2nd 100m freestyle and 4th 50m freestyle.


Leigh Shillington 11/12 year old girls - 6th 100m freestyle, 7th 100m




Angela has been involved in gymnastics for the past five years and was introduced to the sport as a member of the Halton Hills Jills Gymnastics Club.

Angela will be facing some added pressure at the Halifax national meet, as the Ontario team has placed first for the past 13 years.




