Too Many Cooks make a good mix

Too Many Cooks made their Toronto club debut at the Horseshoe Tavern on Monday. A Montreal based band (although the core duo are natives of Sherbrooke in the Eastern Townships), the Cooks proved to be a hard rocking, very energetic quintet with an edge.

Led by vocalist Richard D' (D'Anjou), the group features Dan Georgesco on guitar and keyboards, Paul Tougas on guitar, Jean Francols Lemieux on bass, and Benoit Clement on drums. Apparently five is just the right number for the broth, because the sound was tight and tense, quite the opposite of their debut album, Too Many Cooks, on their own label, Main Street.

The album could have been made by another group, the music is so different. The songs on the album have a definite pop flavor, nothing too arresting or original. Live, however, the songs verged on speed metal, rough and hard, giving the listener a whole different impression of the group. It is rare to hear a band with such a split personality on record and stage.

On stage, singer Richard D' jumped around, drank lots of


water, then spit most of it out on the members of the band. The rest of the troupe did not seem to mind in the least, and the guitarists played off each other and D'. D' and Georgesco are the only members of the band to appear on the album - the rest are 'hired guns'. Judging by the way they performed as an ensemble, these guns should definitely stick together.

Outstanding numbers were Rita, a Beatles tinged tune with the promise of a top forty hit; I Refuse to Die, typical of the tough sound not found on the record (nor is the song), Don't Take Me Away, which is on the album but sounds a lot better live, and some extremely pretty ballads like Where Have You Been. Unlike the usual hard rock bands slow songs, the Cook's ballads had texture and depth, with some truly lovely riffs.

The founding members met in a kitchen and used to jam there. There is also a bootleg record of a Rolling Stones song called Too Many Cooks; hence the name. The group toured with British pop star Samantha Fox last year, garnering their first national exposure. If they keep up the live sound, they should have no trouble gaining national recognition in the next couple of years.
