Employment centre matches students with employers

Students who are looking for summer jobs can register with the Canada Employment Centre for Students (CECS) as placement began on Monday, Robin Quon, CECS supervisor said.

About 150 students have registered on their first open day and through pre-opening registration sessions at both Georgetown District High School and Acton District High School, Mr. Quon said.

CECS placed 25 students into summer jobs last year, Mr. Quon said. 629 students registered for 425 jobs, he said.

This year CECS has already lined up 40 jobs.

Mr. Quon said businesses contact the government office telling them what they are looking for and once the students come into the CECS office Mr. Quon and Student Placement Officer, Susan Shepherd, refer the students to the employer.

This way, if a student specializes in a specific field, CECS may be able to find them a job within that field, Mr. Quon explained.

He said CECS is looking for some students who are "eager, reliable and responsible."

Ideally, CECS wants to place all of the students in Halton Hills with a job for the summer, he said.

"A lot of them (the students) use the service for years," Mr. Quon said. Even after the students pass high school they use it to get jobs while they're in college or university, he explained.

"It's about half and half" returning students and new students that

register, Mr. Quon noted.

The Georgetown CECS is located at 232 Guelph Street at the Mountainview Road intersection, and is open Monday to Friday's between 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at the rear of the building.

Acton students can register at the Acton District High School student services office. Mr. Quon notes that students are highly recommended to be very detailed in filling out their registration cards.
