Spike dared to be different

TORONTO - There are a lot of tales about Spike Jones.

At the height of his popularity in the 1940s and 1950s, the band leader, drummer and humorist called everything from "innovator" to "the man who set music back at least a thousand years."

The Spike Jones Story, a onehour documentary that airs on CBC-TV May 29, looks at both the personal and professional life of the flamboyant musical humorist.

In the Benny Goodman big band era, when music and musicians were conservative, Spike Jones stood out like a nudist at a Chamber of Commerce meeting.

Spike, with his chewing gum, loud checkered suits and wild props, dared to be different.

He offered satirical versions of "serious music." The Spike Jones and his City Slickers' adaption of You Always Hurt The One You

Love (the Mills Brothers hit song) became a major hit, as did their version of Liberace's September Song.

Jones appeared in several movies and was given his own show by CBS-TV in 1954,

He died at age 53 in 1965 of a respiratory ailment.

The documentary includes clips of the late musician performing some of his hits and interviews with his widow and some of the people who worked closely with him.

This is the way Milton Berle remembers Spike Jones: "He will go down in the annals of show business as the guy who brought something different to an audience."

May movie video releases are National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation (May 9); Dad (May 10); The Little Mermaid (May 18) and The Fabulous Baker Boys (May 24).

Jim Henson, the man who unleashed the Muppets on an unsuspecting world, has agreed to produce a four-part miniseries version of Gulliver's Travels for NBC.
