Ontario-based musicians receive promotion cash

Toronto - New Canadian talent is looking to break into the lucrative American and international recording market at the 11th annual New Music Seminar (NMS), to be held July 14 - 18 in New York.

To help them gain a foothold in the US industry, Ontario Culture and Communications Minister Christine Hart today presented the Songwriters Association of Canada with a cheque for \$40,000 for the promotion of Ontario-based musi-

"The promotional efforts in New York are two-fold," siad Ms. Hart. "One is to make the international music community aware of the range and depth of talent available in Canada. The second is to provide our artists with the opportunity for one-on-one meetings with international labels and management. Together, they give our talent an opportunity for development within the industry."

A special compact disc featuring 39 Canadian artists. (28 Ontariobased) will be produced by the Songwriters Association of Canada and Intrepid Records. Indie Can '90 will then be distributed at NMS,

North America's largest trade fair for the recording industry. Over 8,000 industry people are expected to attend this year's seminar, including record company executives and producers from over 20 countries.

"In the past rive years, the New Music Seminar has opened doors to the international market for such innovative recording artists as The Pursuit of Happiness, Cowboy Junkies, Mary Margaret O'Hara and Chalk Circle," said Ms. Hart. "Many countries now look to Canada and Ontario for fresh ideas and talent."
