Church meeting

The 68th annual meeting of Toronto Conference of The United Church of Canada will be held May 25-27, 1990 at the Pickering Recreation Complex, 1867 Valley Farm Road, Pickering.

Theme speaker for the conference is Rev. Dr. Gerald Shepard, professor at the United Church's Emmanuel College.

Rev. David McKane of Eglinton United Church, Toronto, will be installed as the Conference's president.

Approximately 550 delegates from 350 congregations will consider 61 resolutions and petitions calling for action by the Conference or the upcoming General Council in August in London, Ont.

Of the 39 petitions to the General Council level of the church, roughly 25 relate to the church's 1988 statement "Membership, Ministry and Human Sexuality" or to issues of sexuality or church government.

Delegates will be asked to consider other issues ranging from opposition to the construction of a four-lane highway through the village of Nobel to encouraging dialogue between rural and urban people within the conference.

Stratford Festival 1990 writer's series

The Stratford Festival's 1990 Celebrated Writers Series will feature stimulating seminar weekends with two of Canada's most distinguished writers, Robertson Davies and Sharon Pollock. The weekend with Professor Davies will take place, June 8, 9 and 10, and the weekend with Ms. Pollock, September 7, 8 and 9.

Robertson Davies is an internationally celebrated novelist, playwright, essayist and scholar. His works include the critically-acclaimed novel 'Fifth Business', 'What's Bred in the Bone', and the recent best seller 'The Lyre of Orpheus.'

Sharon Pollock is one of Canada's leading playwrights and an Associate Director of the 1990 Stratford Festival. Winner of the Governor General's Literary Award for Drama for 'Blood Relations' (1981) and 'Doc' (1986) she is also the author of 'Walsh' (presented at Stratford in 1974) and this year's production of 'One Tiger to a Hill.'

A full weekend seminar package costs \$295. per person and includes top price tickets to four plays; admission to guest lecture and discussion; a private reading by the guest lecturer; a discussion group with theatre staff or company; a wine and cheese reception with the Festival company; luncheon in the Festival Terrace Marquee; a backstage tour of the Festival Theatre and two nights Bed and Breakfast accommodation. The full Sharon Pollock Weekend Package is still available. The Robertson Davies Weekend Package is fully subscribed but tickets for Pro-

fessor Davies' Lecture, Sunday, June 10, at 10:30 a.m. are still available at a cost of \$10. per person.


