





#### ONTARIO UNIOR CITIZEN OF THE YEAR AWARDS

#### Who is a Junior Citizen

Any resident of Ontario, aged 6 to 18 years, is eligible to receive an Ontario Junior Citizen of the Year Award. Groups or individuals may be nominated.

Nominees may be involved in worthwhile community service, have overcome disabling physical or psychological limitations, or have performed acts of heroism perhaps endangering their own lives.

Award recipients will also be "good kids" who show a commitment to make life better for others and do more than is normally expected of someone their age.

#### The Awards

A committee of community newspaper editors and representatives of the patron, Canadian Airlines International, will select the award recipients from all the nominations received.

Up to 12 individuals and one group will be recipients of an award presented by the Lieutenant Governor during the Ontario Community Newspapers Association convention in March. Recipients and their families are invited to the presentation luncheon and to a reception hosted by the Lieutenant Governor.

The Ontario Junior Citizens of the Year receive a plaque citing their accomplishments, a Junior Citizen of the Year lapel pin, \$200.00 and a family portrait with the Lieutenant Governor.

All other nominees will receive a certificate recognizing their nomination.
