# Peel Selects come up short

The Peel Juvenile Selects travelled to Edmonton last week and competed on May 11, 12 and 13. On Friday in the round-robin they lost their opening matches to Winnipeg and Calgary.

The Calgary team (eventually Gold medalists) was very strong and the Selects lost this match 14-16 in the third game.

The Selects won their next two matches against Nova Scotia and Grand Prairie to end up 2 and 2 for Friday's play.

On Saturday morning, the Selects met Quebec No 1 and were in the position that the winner of this match would advance to the medal side of the competition and the best the loser could do would be 7th!

The match of three games took one and three-quarter hours - the quality of play was excellent and the players were exhausted!

The Selects lost the first game 12-15 and then came back to win 15-4, 15-7. (Very tough match and it took them a long time to earn points - both teams played good 'sideout' volleyball.)

The team then had to travel to another site, request additional warm-up time and take on the Edmonton Volleyball Club in quarter final action.

This match (2 out of 3) took one hour and 15 minutes to play and the Selects won 15-4, 16-14.

By this point the girls were totally exhausted - the pressure of the tournament level of play, and number of intense games in a short period of time saw them go down to Calgary in the semis 14-16, 10-15, 4-15 (semis and finals were 3 out of 5.)

Calgary went on to defeat Sherbrooke (Quebec) for the Gold medal.

The Selects stopped hitting and playing aggressively lost to Manitoba in the Bronze medal match; scores were 15-4, 9-15, 15-17, 15-5 and 10-15.

Coach McArthur was pleased with the performance of the players and many people at the tournament commented on the level of play from this Ontario squad.

National team coach Mike Burchuk was very impressed. Fourth in Canada at the juvenile level is excellent.
