The municipality of Halton Hills has concern regarding the sanitary removal of dog excrement in parks and public lands. The humorous side of the issue tends to cloud the serious facts of animal waste. Not only is the sight and smell of dog excrement distasteful, it is a carrier of many infectious diseases and a health hazard to everyone, in particular the very young.

The Town of Halton Hills By-law No. 84-121, provides that "the owner of every dog shall be responsible for the removal and sanitary disposal of any excrement of the said dog forthwith from any private or public lands (owner means any person temporarily the keeper). There is a \$25.00 fine for the first offence and a \$50.00 fine for each subsequent offence.

Parks and public lands in the municipality are maintained for the enjoyment of all residents. PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG.

The triumphant Georgetown ladies bowling team is prepping for a national championship gold medal.

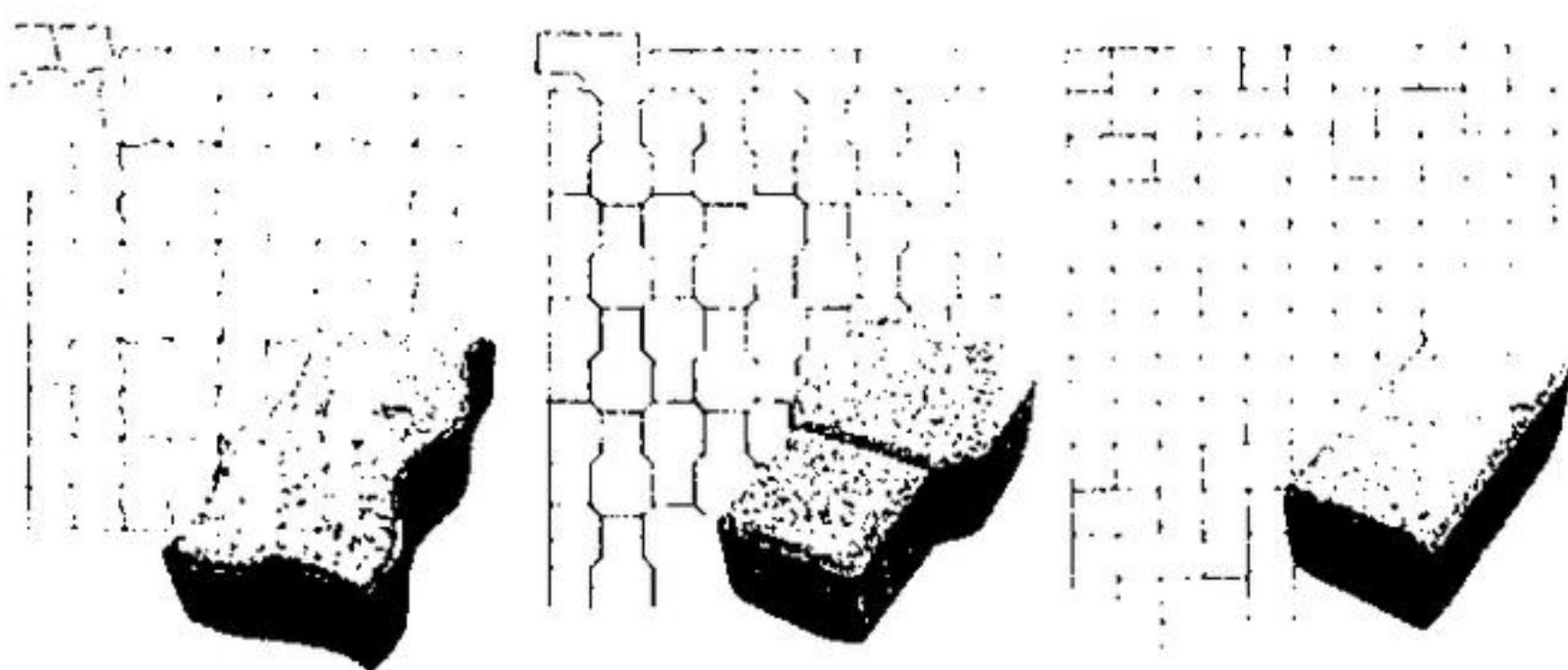
Having won the provincial gold championship, they will be going on an all-expenses paid trip to Edmonton as Ontario's representatives to the finals on May 25, 26th and 27th.

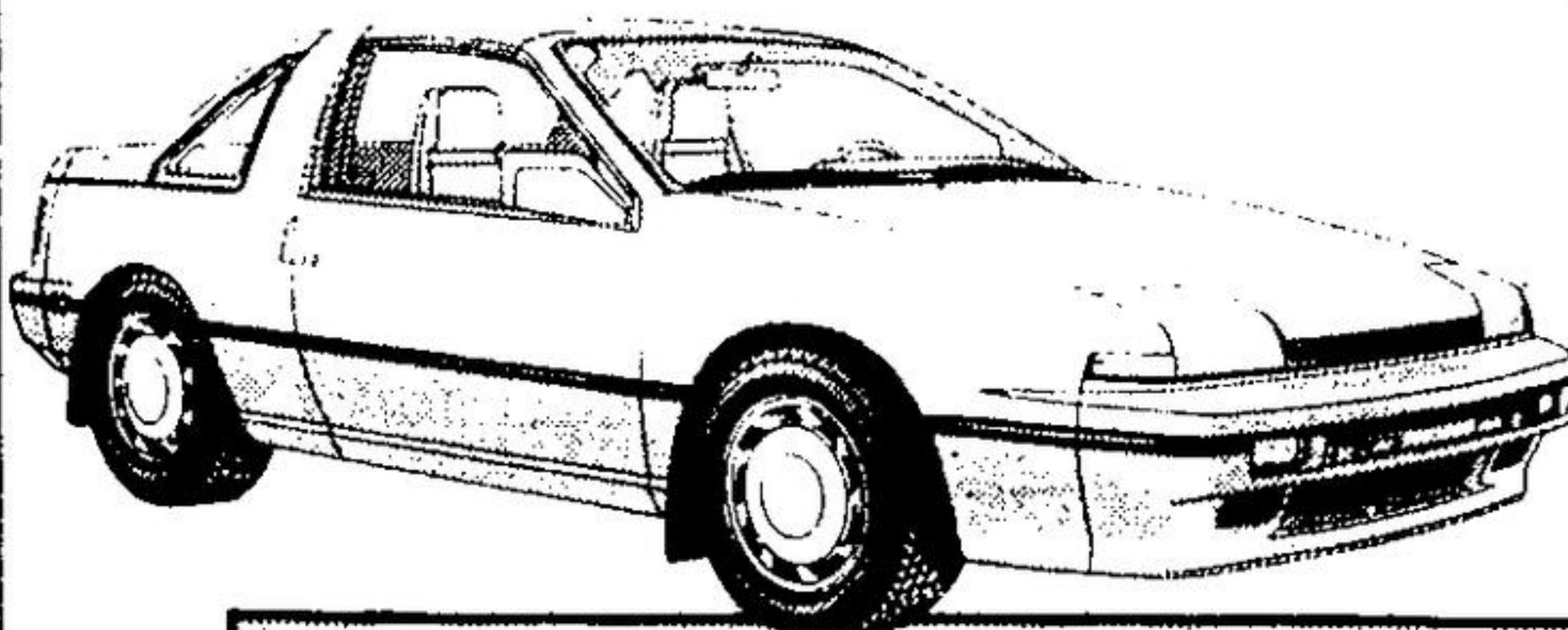
