Pink Floyd's "The Wall" is one of the most popular pieces of conceptual rock ever recorded. The 1979 album sold 19 million copies, and the video of the 1981 film still sells briskly.

Essentially a performance piece, "The Wall" has actually only been staged in four cities. And when Floyd co-founder Roger Waters left the band, it was assumed that the classic would never again be seen live. Waters was once asked if he would be performing "The Wall" solo, and answered something to the effect of "Yeah, when they tear down the Berlin Wall, maybe"

OK, you're ahead of us. "The Wall" will, in fact, be performed July 21 right on the Potsdamer Platz - what was no-man's-land between East and West Berlin. The monster show is being engineered by the people who staged Live-Aid, and it will feature symphony orchestras, military aircraft, some of the world's top rock talent, and inflatable characters the size of a football field.

The massive event will benefit the Memorial Fund for Disaster Relief, a UK-based emergency charity, and will be televised around most of the planet.
