

# Police search Canada for fraud suspect


Halton Regional Police A Canada-wide warrant has been issued by the Halton Regional Police for the arrest of Ronald Michael Kaziuk, wanted for several counts of fraud.

It is alleged that in February and March of this year, the Oakville area was targeted by Raziuk where he was active in fraudulent activities. During this ...time period financial institutions. were defrauded of over \$5,000.00.

A description of the suspect follows: 36 years of age, white, 170 cm (5'7') in height, weighing 68 kg (149 lbs.), with brown hair.



# First Line reconstruction

Blue Springs Development will have to wait until Monday to find out if Halton Hills councillors will give the developer final approval to reconstruct the First Line just outside Acton.

The town's general committee, which is comprised of town councillors, recommended the reconstruction go ahead, at Monday night's general committee meeting.
