

# Open Door plans several fund raisers

Open Door is planning a series of fund raisers and events to finish the 1989-90 season. The first of these will take place on Thursday, June 21, at 7:30 p.m. at St. George's Church on Guelph Street. It is a demonstration of a brand new line of skin care products from Nu Skin, a company that has recently moved into Canada.

The products are non-animal tested and feature biodegradable containers. There is an emphasis on natural, herbal ingredients, although the line is very sophisticated and uses up-to-the-minute technology. The company began seven years ago, when some disenchanted skin-care experts began to question the items they were producing. Shampoos, skin and body care items, and subliminal tapes on stopping smoking, dieting, and general life enhancement will be on sale. All the profits will go to Open Door.

Summer's here and the time is right for dancing in the streets... well, not the streets, but Open Door will hold a School's Out Dance at the Memorial Arena on Mill St. on June 29. The dance will run from 7:30 to 11:30 p.m., admission is \$5.00, and the first 500 kids will be admitted. There will be door prizes of tapes, Levis jeans, and a few

surprise giveaways. Fifty Levis articles such as jeans and pants will be on sale.

On Canada Day, Open Door will again have a booth at the Glen Williams celebrations. This year the following items will be sold: popcorn, nachos and cheese, caramel corn, candy floss, and drinks. Products are supplied by Poppa Corn, and all proceeds go to Open Door. In addition, there will be a booth with Levis products; the company has donated about 250 items and they will be sold to benefit Open Door.

In July there will be a car wash, and plans are afoot to hold a large outdoor Summerfest concert in August with live local bands. More details will be available on these events as the summer wears on.
