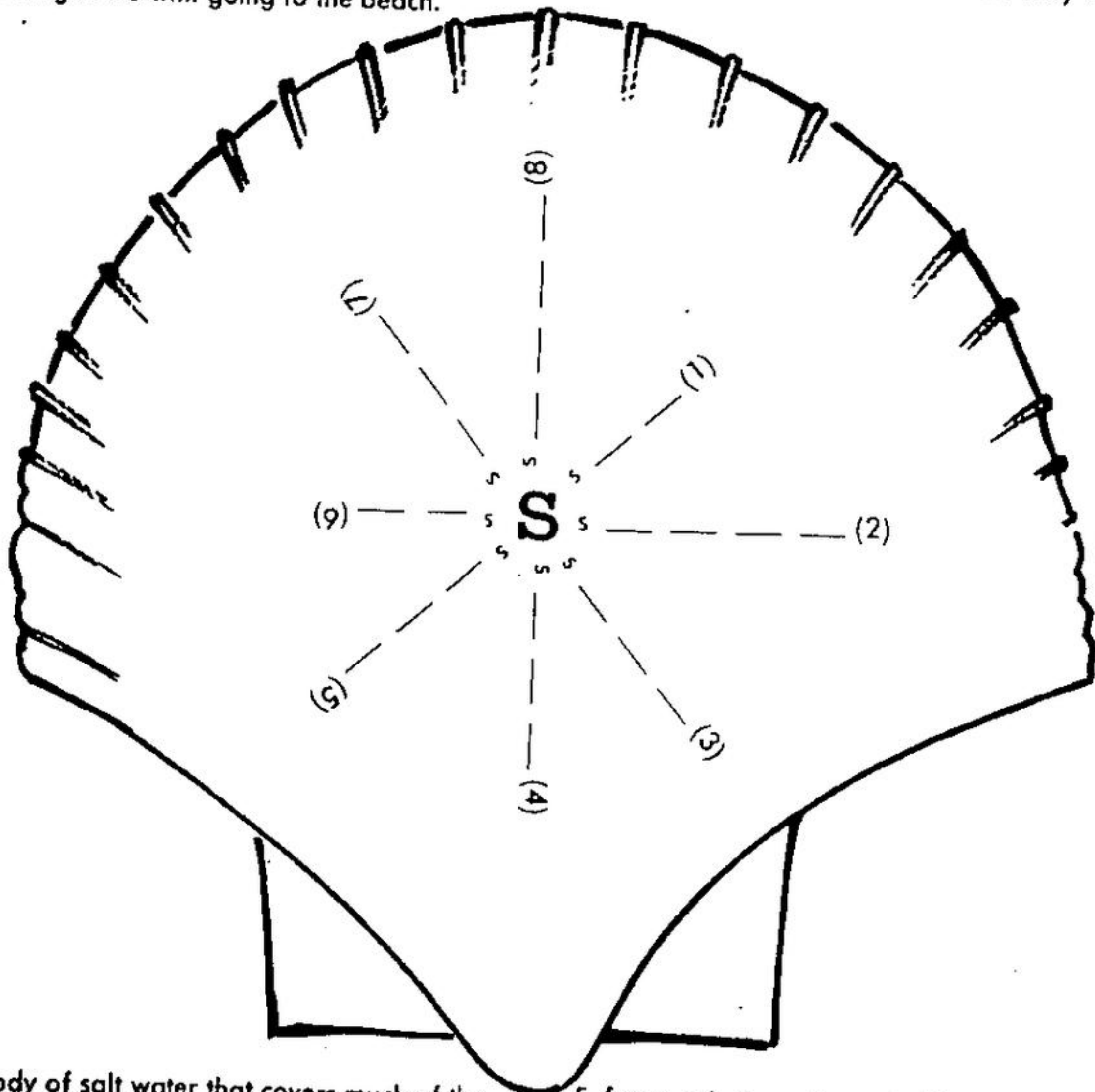
When playing on the beach, be sure to wear a hat and sunscreen so that your skin doesn't burn. Also, drink plenty of water.

Use the definitions below to figure out which "s" words fit in the blanks inside of the shell. They all have something to do with going to the beach.

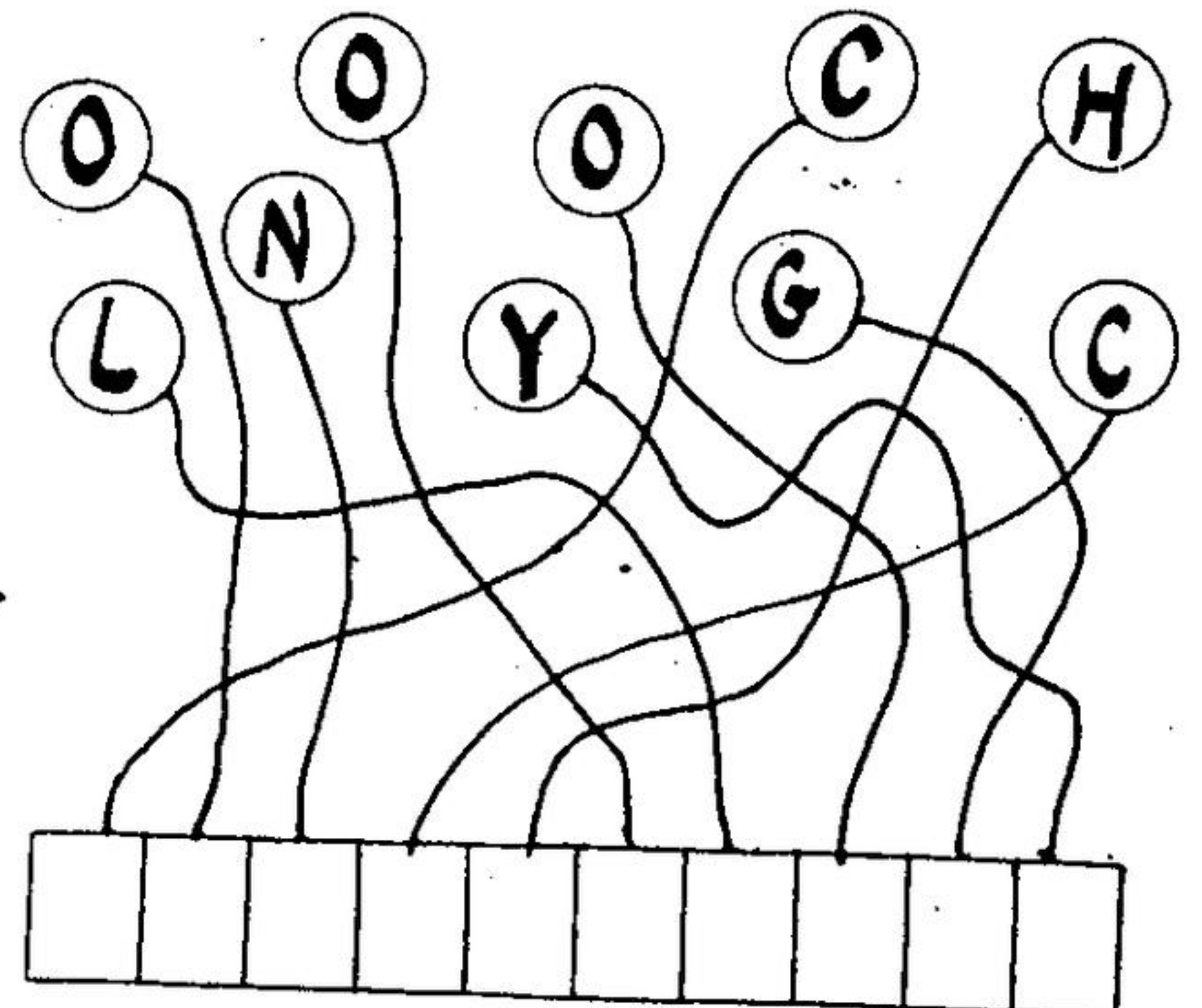


1. great body of salt water that covers much of the Earth
