The good guys really exploded as they scored nine runs in the inning.

Doug Inglis collected his 4th RBI of the game and Humeniski a 2-run double.

The remaining runs were scored on heads-up base running on past balls.

The bottom of the inning was a classic, as the opposition went down in order on two ground balls and a pop-up. It was cold, wet, and almost dark, but the Georgetown players, coaches and supporters didn't care. The first win of the year couldn't have come at a better time.
