Raising the flag

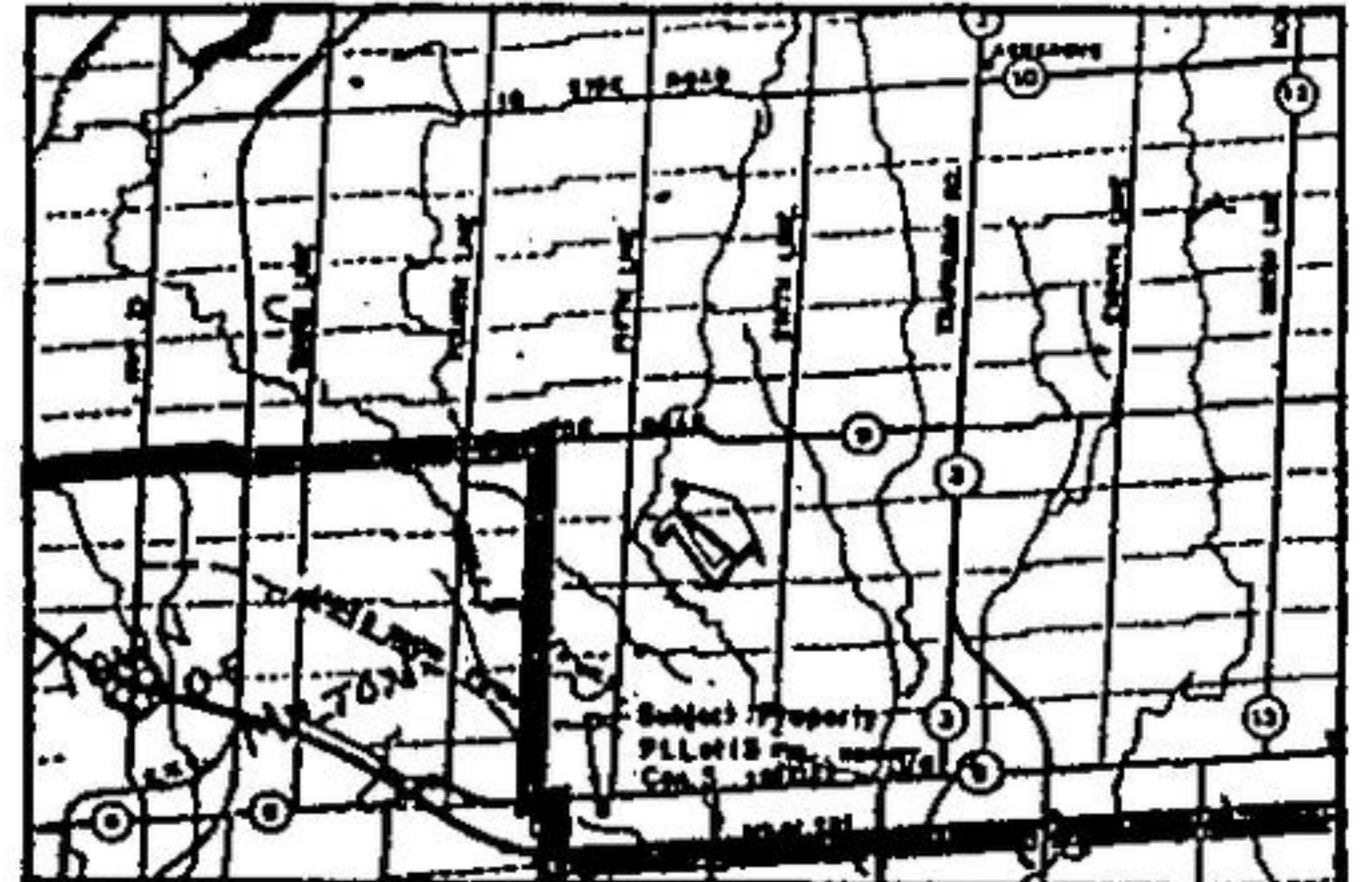
